

ROWLAND, RICE, JAMIESON LOWER FORMER MARKS

Fresnans Win Thirteen Of
Fifteen Firsts; Score
107 Points

Winning thirteen out of fifteen first places and smashing three Far Western Conference records as they breezed along, Fresno State's Bulldogs retained their Far Western Conference track and field championship her last night at the college stadium.

Flint Hanner's athletes scored 107 points, almost twice as much as their three opponents. Chico State finished second with 31 points, Nevada scored 19 and the California Aggies of Davis, 8.

The three conference records to be broken were in the 440 which Lysle Jamieson of Fresno ran in 49.3 seconds; in the javelin in which Clarence Rowland of Fresno cracked his own conference record with a throw of 215 feet, 5 inches, and in the two-mile run in which little Eldridge Rice of Fresno trudged the eight laps in 9:46.6.

Jamieson Is Star

Jamieson proved the evening's star. Besides setting the 440-yard record, he won the 220-yard dash and ran the final anchor lap in the mile relay won by Fresno. Granny Holbrook of Fresno was another double winner with firsts in the shot and discus. Beverly Gubser of Fresno also came out a twin champion, taking both hurdle races.

Ullom of Chico, winning the 100, and Sullivan of Chico taking the broad jump, took the only first places from Fresno.

Only about 300 fans watched Fresno win its fifth consecutive conference championship.

Lawrence Wins Mile

Jimmy Lawrence marked up Fresno's first victory in the mile run, the opening event. Lawrence let Ivan Ivancovich, a teammate, and Paul Leonard of Nevada set the pace until the stretch, when he moved out in front to beat Ivancovich by a nose.

Leonard finished two strides back of Ivancovich, who set the pace the last two laps after taking the lead from Robert Manley of Chico State.

Eric Butterworth of Fresno pulled up in fourth place. The 4:37 time was slow.

Ullom Wins Century

Chico scored a first place in the century, with Chester Ullom coming through a winner in the fast time of 9.9 with a strong wind to his back. The time was a tenth of a second slower than the conference record, set by Milt Hoit of Fresno last year. Ullom beat off the stirring finish by Douglas McGow of Nevada, the favorite, to win by a step.

The first conference record to fall came in the quarter-mile sprint with Jamieson, red-headed Fresno Stater, breasting the tape in 49.3, two-tenths of a second better than the old record held by Bob Hanson of Fresno, set last year. Hanson offered a serious challenge to Jamieson in the stretch, but Jamieson beat off his teammate and won by three yards.

Fresno State copped first and second places in the high hurdles with Gubser setting the pace all the way and winning by a yard or so over Bill Van Oedel, a teammate, in the fast time of 14.9.

Holbrook Is Winner

Granny Holbrook checked in another first place for Fresno, capturing the shotput event, his best heave of the season, although eight inches back of his record. His best effort measured 47.10½.

The two-mile mark was the second conference record to go by the boards, Eldridge Rice of Fresno running the trick as he won with ease over his competitors. Rice clipped off the strenuous eight-lap run in 9:46.6. The old record was 9:57.8, set in 1933 by Stoddard of San Jose. Rice won by nearly half a lap from Leonard of Nevada.

The time in the half mile event, won by Gill of Fresno, was disappointing. Gill was clocked in 2 minutes, 23 seconds. Gill sprinted ahead of Lloyd Courtney of Fresno in the stretch to win by six yards. Ralph, also of Fresno, beat Courtney out at the tape line by a few inches.

Jamieson became the first double

winner when he entered and won the 220-yard dash after smashing the conference record in the quarter. Jamieson took the furlong in the fast time of 21.6, three-tenths of a second under the record.

Rowland, the stellar javelin thrower, set the third conference record of the night when he flung the spear 215 feet and 5 inches, wiping from the record book his old mark of 207 feet, set last year. Warmerdam of Fresno won his specialty, the pole vault, but missed tying his conference record by half an inch. The Fresnan vaulted 13 feet, 5½ inches. He tried for 13.9 but missed three attempts.

John Croson gave Fresno another first in the high jump, leaping 6 feet, 1½ inches, with Van Osdel and Keller, also of Fresno, tied for second at 6 feet, ½ inch.

Gubser and Holbrook also came through as double winners after winning the low hurdles. Gubser came back to take the low sticks in 24 flat, beating out his strongest competitor, Dave Wright of the Aggies, by a yard and a half.

Holbrook moved over from the shot put ring, where he took first, to the discuss circle and took the platter event with a throw of 134 feet, 4 inches. Ken Gleason of Fresno took second and gave Fresno more points in its highly mounting total.

Richards Lame

Lenyon Richards of Nevada, a Visalia boy and conference broad jump record holder, was handicapped with a bad leg and did not retain his title in this event. Charles Sullivan of Chico State won with a short leap of 21 feet, 10¾ inches, nearly three feet less than Richards' record.
