Records fell as numerously and as fast as leaves in autumn yesterday afternoon at Knight's Field in Marysville at the annual Golden Valley Conference Track and Field Meet.

Aided by a strong wind, records in the 100 and 220-yard dashes and 440-yard run were broken. Besides dash marks being set, the shot put mark was equaled, and pole vault smashed in a meet that saw American River JC come out on top with a total of 152 points. Sierra was second with $93\frac{1}{2}$ points with Yuba third, $59\frac{1}{2}$ points. Shasta had 29 markers, Napa 12, Lassen 11, and Marin 7.

American River sprinter Al Kellogg, who ran for El Camino High School two years ago, was by far the most outstanding performer of the day, breaking the 100- and 200-yard dash records in times of 9.5 and 20.7 seconds

respectively, and tying for first in the highjump with Bill Hotschkiss of Sierra at a height of 5 feet 10½ inches. Kellogg's sprint records will have to come up before the league before they may be counted official because of the strong wind.

Probably the best performance of the day was given by Yuba College sprinter Charles McNiff who tied the GVC 440-yard dash mark in 49.9 seconds, despite running into the wind the last 120 yards.

Bill Popejoy of American River tossed the 16 - pound shot 47 feet even to tie the old league record while Bill Norrish of Sierra vaulted 13 feet three inches to better the old mark of 12 feet four inches by 11 inches.

One of the biggest surprises of the day came when the Yuba College mile relay squad of Bob Mastelotto, Dennis Moore, Gil Krause and McNiff came home in a time of 3:37.6 to win by five yards over American River.

Other top performers yesterday were Kieth Gittens of A. R. who walked away with the mile in 4:39 minutes and the two-mile run he lapped the field in 10:53.6 minutes. Ed Baine of Sierra came home in the 880-yard run in 2:01.9 minutes. Jim Banres ran the 120 - yard high hurdles in 15.5 seconds, and Dick Stark of American River took the 220-yard low hurdles in 24.4 bettering the old conference mark of 24.6.

The first four place winners are entitled to enter the Northern California Junior College sectional meet at Santa Rosa later this month.

The meet was scored on a 10-7-5-3-1 point distribution. Following are the complete results of the meet.
