

SANTA ANA WIN CHAFFEY MEET

Pomona Is Second, While Cards
Take Fifth; Lockabey Sets
New Mark for Mile

ONTARIO, March 24.—In the "wettest meet in Southern California," the Santa Ana Saints splashed and slid about the Chaffey track and field here today to make the 36 points which gave them the first place cup in the open meet of the third annual Chaffey invitational trackfest.

Pomona high school was a close second with 32½ points, Redlands took third with 18. Elsinore was fourth with 13, San Bernardino fifth with 10, and Riverside sixth with 8 points. Huntington Beach and Fullerton each took 7 points, Perris 5, Orange 4, Chino Vocational 3, South Pasadena, Chaffey and Anaheim each had 2 points, Banta 1½, and Tustin 1.

Santa Ana placed Velarde fourth in the 100, Warner second in the 440 and fourth in the shot put, Cone was first in the 880, Donahue third in the mile, Rebain third in the 320 lows and the 120 highs, Moffatt second in the high and fourth in the low sticks, Hearn tied for third in pole vault, Rust first in the discus and third in shot, Musick second in the discus. The Saints won first in class A relay.

Two Track

Records Made

Of the four C. B. L. schools which rated high in the meet here today, Redlands and San Bernardino claimed the only athletes who broke any of the existing records for this meet. Lockabey, of San Bernardino, won the mile in 4:38 flat, breaking the mark set by Breeding of Santa Ana last year, of 4:39.7. Not hard pushed and running on the wet track here, Lockabey indicates that he will set a new C. B. L. mark next Saturday at Redlands. Brooks of Redlands took second to Lockabey today, but will probably not be able to beat him next week. Woessner, of Redlands, ran the 440 in the fast time of :50.8, bettering the record formerly held by Reeder, of Chaffey, at :53.6.

Chaffey's low rating in the open meet does not necessarily mean that she is the lowest in the league, as the majority of Pop Kekley's boys competed in the novice events, while the other C. B. L. schools entered their athletes in the opener. The standings of the schools for the novice events were: Chaffey, first, 21½; Huntington Beach, 16½; Citrus, 15; Monrovia, 11; Riverside, 8; Hemet, 7; Orange 5½; Anaheim, 3; Santa Ana, 1.

In the Class A relay race, Pomona led until the final lap when time was lost in the passing of the baton. Santa Ana had been running a close second, led on the final stretch to win. Those on the Saints' team were Rebain, Rust, Warner and Velarde. Elsinore's team, which took first in the Class B relay was composed of Chandler, Walters, Suttler and Kirpatrick.

Cardinals Make

Splendid Showing

San Bernardino placed as follows in the open meet: Dabell fourth in 440-yard dash, Balston third in

the 880, Lockabey first in the mile, Hill fourth in the broad jump and the relay team fourth in Class A. Redlands placed Dow second in the 220, Woessner first in the 440, Wilson fourth in the 880, Brooks second in the mile, Van Osdel second in the high jump and Gardner second in the pole vault.

Pomona took second with Casey third in the 100 and fourth in the 220; Rose was third in the 440; Keough first in the low hurdles, third in the high jump, first in the broad jump, first in the pole vault; Zillgett second in the low hurdles and first in the high sticks, and second in the Class A relay. Riverside made eight points by placing Riker one of two tied for first in 100, third in the 220 and Thomas third in the broad jump.
