

San Bernardino, Chaffey Cinder Stars Shine in Invitational Meet

In a meet featured by broken records, Chaffey and San Bernardino high schools yesterday dominated the seventh annual Chaffey Invitational at Ontario.

Chaffey's Tigers, aided by a near-sweep in the pole vault, won the open meet with a total of 24 1/2 points, earning permanent possession of the Invitational cup for their third victory in seven years. The Tigers were followed closely by San Bernardino, with 21 1/2 points.

Cards in Third

Novice Triumph

The same number of points, 21 1/2, enabled San Bernardino to win its third successive triumph in the novice division, and secure permanent possession of the yearling cup, easily outdistancing the field.

Eleven new records were set in the two divisions, while two were tied. Novice entries claimed the majority of the new marks, setting up eight, while three open performances were eclipsed, and two were tied.

Cliff Proget, San Bernardino star, set a new record in the 100 yard dash of 8.9 seconds, breaking the former mark of 9.1 seconds, set by Spurr, Santa Pasadena, a year ago. Proget also won the 200 yard dash in 23.8 seconds, tied for second in the pole vault with a leap of 21 feet, and ran a lap on the winning relay team.

His 21 1/2 points earned high point honors for the meet, and he was presented with the Knute Rockne memorial plaque by Chaffey officials for his performance, one of the most outstanding in the history of the Chaffey classic.

San Bernardino's relay team, composed of Proget, Jay Gregory, Leonard Charvet and Harold Stewart, equaled the existing time in the 800 yard relay, of 1 min. 32.7 seconds, set by Santa Ana in 1938.

Set New Records

Two novice records were claimed by San Bernardino runners, both set in the preliminary trials yesterday morning. Leonard Charvet clinched over the low hurdles in an even 25 seconds, clipping 1.8 seconds off the mark set by Larrabee, Santa Ana, last year, while Ralph Hilbig lowered the record in the 200 yard dash from 32.7 seconds to 27.8 seconds. The old mark was set by Harold Stewart, San Bernardino, in 1938. Both won their events in the finals in slower time.

Next to Cliff Proget's performance in the 100, the next best individual mark of the day was made by Gillette, El Centro star, when he ran the 400 in 49.8 seconds, lowering the old mark of Art Wessener, Redlands, set in 1928, by a full second. Wessener is now a star at the University of Southern California, and was last year rated the third best quarter-mile in the country, behind only Vic Williams and Ben Kautman.

Chaffey's Total

The other open record broken was in the broad jump, when Pullard, Monrovia, sailed out 22 feet, 1 1/2 inches, to add 1 1/2 inches to the old record of Paul, Santa Ana, made in 1926.

Chaffey's triumph in the open division, thereby losing out Santa Ana for the three-year cup, was made largely possible by eight points in the pole vault. Miller was the event, Dell tied for second, and Hawkins grabbed a tie for fourth place. The Tigers took a smattering of points from most of the other events on the card, to pile up a steady margin. Eight in the 800, high hurdles, low hurdles, mile, discus, high jump, shot put, broad jump and relay all helped swell the Chaffey total.

Next to Miller's performance in the pole vault, Chaffey's best mark was registered by Hopley, who took a second in the mile, behind Hooper, of Antelope valley, who ran a steady, well-timed race, to give the Mountaineers their only points of the meet.

Cotton's only points in the open division were taken by Ivan Castle, with a toss of 128 feet 9 1/2 inches in the discus, to annex first place. The Yellowjackets scored eight points in the novice division, Anderson and Powell placing in the broad jump, Tilden in the 800 and Leon in the shot put.

Terrific High in

Novice Division

True to advance predictions, Coach Bill Young's Redlands Terrifics failed to place in the open meet, but garnered 11 1/2 points in the novice division.

Covina, which took fifth in the open meet, scored largely through the efforts of Max Glasco and Chauncey. Glasco and Chauncey placed one-two in the shot put, to take eight points. Glasco also grabbed a third in the high hurdles, while Nealey came through for a second in the 200, and Glasco tied for fourth in the high jump.

Pomona led Riverside in the open division, taking six points, to three for the Bears, while the two teams tied with 5 1/2 in the novice class.
