## El Centro's Two-Man Track Team Takes Second

## Annual Invitational Tangle Attracts Prepmen

## Six New Marks Chalked Up by Star Performers

Chaffey Union High School's tracksters won the annual Chaffey invitational meet at Ontario yesterday with a score of 36 points, but the Tigers were given plenty of opposition by Gillette and Kirkpatrick, El Centro's two-man team.

This pair won four events, set two new records, then teamed up in the 220 relay to burn up the track as El Centro set a new mark of 1m. 32.3s. Gillette won the 440 in the record time of 48.3s. and flashed to a 10-flat win in the century. Kirkpatrick copped the 120-yard high hurdles in the record time of 15.2s. and finished first in the 220-yard low hurdles in the good time of 24.2s.

Six new records were established as the cream of twenty-two Southern California high schools battled for the glory of their respective colors.

Chaffey won the meet because Coach W. H. Kegley had a well-balanced team that picked up points in most of the events. El Centro, thanks to Gillette and Kirkpatrick, finished second with 25 points, Santa Ana scored 19½ points for third place and Fullerton wound up in fourth place with 12 digits.

Hosper, veteran Antelope Valley miler who holds the State championship, lowered the meet record by one and three-tenths seconds as he rambled to an easy victory in 4m. 37s. Jordan of Whittier ran a nice race until the final lap, when an ill-timed sprint killed him off.

El Centro's chances of winning the meet were given a stiff blow when Madlem failed to score in the broad jump. The lad left El Centro at midnight in order to reach Ontario in time for the meet. He drove all night and reached his destination tired and stale and consequently failed in an event in which he has consistently bettered the mark that won.
