

S. A. TRACKMEN TAKE THIRD IN CHAFFEY MEET

Spring vacation today brought a week of rest for Santa Ana high school's embattled track team before the impending "big meet" of the fall season.

No organized practice will be held this week but the Saint athletes will work out individually when they can find time. Coach Bruce Greene announced he had scheduled a dual meet with Fullerton to be held here a week from Wednesday, April 14. This will come three days before the Coast League preliminaries at Glendale.

Santa Ana came closer than it expected to winning the tenth annual Chaffey Invitational meet last Saturday. As it was, Saint forces finished third with 27 1/2 points. Chaffey was as expected, making 24 1/2. El Monte was second with 25.

Only Bill Hawkins' disqualification in the high hurdles kept Santa Ana out of second place. Hawkins was hardly but knocked down four hurdles. In his qualifying heat, the Saint captain set a new school record of 24.2 seconds. The old mark was held by Hawkins at 24.2.

Another Santa Ana record went by the boards when Saphamore Lee Stafford vaulted 12 feet, 3/4 inch by official measurement. Then they raised the bar to 12.7, and Stafford cleared it on his fourth trial. Coach Greene says Stafford will do 12 feet before the season is over. Erwin Youth, Santa Ana's second star vaulter, scored 11.8, his best feat of the year. He tied for second.

Santa Ana's other points were made by Hawkins, who finished a close second to Chaffey's Vickery



in the low hurdles; Bob Morrison, who high-jumped 5 feet to tie for first place, and Cameron Giles, a surprise fourth in the broad jump at 21 feet.

Stellar performances also were turned in by three of Greene's sophomores who competed in the novice division. Herschel Whitney was the star in 2:19.2, with Dearing Waggoner third. Dwight Nott placed third in the 220-yard low hurdles.
