

ELLIOTT RUNS 50.7: RECORD FOR RELAY MEN

Spring vacation arrived today for Santa Ana high school's track team but Coach Reter Greene ordered his Chaffey Champions to keep in light training for the grid that begins all over again next week.

The Saints won the big Chaffey invitational meet Saturday for the first time in nine years, clinching first place with a record-breaking 1:32 relay. This gave Santa Ana a total of 25 1/2 points. Huntington Beach made it a grand slam for Orange county by pulling in second with 11. Chaffey was third, South Pasadena fourth and Montebello, the defending champion, fifth. Of other county schools that competed, Orange and Newport Harbor got 3, Laguna Beach 4 1/2 and San Juan Capistrano 1.

Relay Record Falls

Jerome Duffy, Leo Mader, Howard Elliott and Wayne Piper, the usual foursome, carried the stick in the relay and they cracked a mark that El Centro rung up in 1933 by three-tenths of a second. The 1:32 race meant that the average 200 was 28 flat. Coach Greene says his quartet will take at least a second off that before the year is over. They won by 20 yards at Chaffey, and were under orders to make every pass sure.

Although Howard Elliott did not establish a Chaffey record in the quarter (it is held by El Centro's Gillett who did 48.9) the Saint ace did smash his own school record when he brooked home a five-yard winner in 50.7 seconds. His old Saint mark was 51.3, made only last week.

Other Santa Ana points were made by Piper, second in the 200 and timed in 21.8; Duffy, fourth in the 100 and second by a foot to Newport's Orville Lloyd in a 24.1 flight of low hurdles; Hal Hill, second in the shot at 45.5; Patricia Rossen, fourth in the shot at 45.5, and John Cleary, tie for second in the high jump at 5.8.

Morris Is Fast

As expected, the great Eddie Morris of Huntington Beach did his stuff in the sprints. He first squallied the meet record of 9.9 in the 100 and then knocked off a 21.5 hurdlap for a new mark.
