

Covina and El Monte Cop Track Titles

Covina in the open and El Monte in the novice swept to victories in the Chaffey invitational track meet at Ontario yesterday with San Bernardino High school taking a hard-earned second place in the novice division.

Coch Yie Hodge's novice athletes scored 18 points to win runner-up honors to El Monte, which amassed 24 1-3 points.

In the open division, the Cards finished seventh with 9 1/2 points. Covina won the open title largely because it scored eight points in the

Colton fared second best of the valley prep schools, scoring eight points to finish tenth in the open meet and fourth in the novice battle.

Redlands High scored four points in the open meet and two in the novice.

BROWN SECOND

Buzz Brown of San Bernardino finished second in the low hurdles and fourth in the high sticks for four points. Bill Inghram took third in the 220 and tied for third with three others in the high jump for 3 1/2 points, while the San Bernardino relay team placed second for three more points.

In the novice battle, Fouls of the Cards was first in the 300, while the San Bernardino relay team also broke the tape for a victory. In addition, Nuncz finished second in the 880, DeJan was second in the low hurdles and Davidson placed third in the 220.

Colton's Gordon Sims won the broad jump and placed second in the 100 to score all the Yellowjacket open points.

The novice meet saw Colton's Palomine and Gonzalez run second and third, respectively, in the 880; a pair of thirds by Arredondo in the low hurdles and the relay team; a tie for third in the pole vault by Anderson; a fourth in the broad jump by Garcia and a tie for fourth in the high jump by Blakely.

Webb, distance star of the Redlands High team, was forced to drop out of the mile after the first lap because of a leg injury. Mendoza of the Terriers finished second in the 880 open race, while Stanton of Redlands took a third in the novice 320.

MORRIS NABS DASHES

Eddie Morris, crack Huntington Beach sprinter, was both the 100 and 220, the first in 8.9 to equal his own meet record and the latter in 21.1 for a new meet record. The Pomona relay team equalled the open meet record in that event in 1:32.

One new novice mark was chalked up when Nelson of El Monte ran the 75-yard high hurdles in 9.2.

Jack Porter of Excelsior was high-point man with 12 points, winning both hurdle races and placing third in the broad jump.
