

El Monte Wins Chaffey Meet

El Monte firmly established itself as the team to beat in C.I.F. spike competition yesterday when it rolled up a total of 41 points to easily win the 19th annual Chaffey invitational track and field meet at Ontario.

The Lions, showing power in the sprints, hurdles, shot-put, broad jump, pole vault and relay, far outdistanced the field of 30 schools. Whittier finished second with 15.

Joe Scott, upset winner over Al Lawrence at the Coliseum last week, won his specialty, the low hurdles, in 24.2s. and also sped the 100 in 10s. flat. Other Lion victors were Snyder, 220, 21.8s.; Blanc, shot-put, 49ft. 1½in.; Kring, pole vault, 12ft. 6in., and the relay team, 1m. 33s.
