Half Mile

Running in terrific weather, hopped-up CIF trackmen, representing 47 schools, pushed a host of marks to new season lows in the 32nd annual Chaffey Invitational yesterday.

Centennial won the open division team title with ease, but the highlights of the meet came in the low hurdles and in the 880.

San Bernardino's Junior Howard, credited with a wind-aided 18.5 lows race last season, flashed to an 18.7 clocking—into the wind. And Compton's Bill Crowley raced the half mile in 1:55.6. Both marks are the best reported in the country to date.

Good Marks

Elsewhere, the events were littered with good marks and fine nonwinning times.

Bruce McCulloch of Pomona won the 440 in 48.4 and the 220 in 21.5, the latter race into the wind. Jack Hudson of El Cajon logged California's best mile time to date with a 4:27.1 victory against an all-star field. In another mile race, Fullerton's Leroy Neal had a 4:27.6 clocking.

In field events, best performances were in the high jump and pole vault. Bellflower's Ron Stuber won the former with a leap of 6ft. 3 3/4 in., while Jim Manning of Anaheim upset Santa Barbara's Charles Breck with a vault of 13ft. 6 3/4 in.

In team scoring, Centennial was the 33 1/2-point victor over runner-up Pomona, which totaled 19.

Compton was favored, but Sprinters Willie Williams and Jimmy Jones were hurt and that decimated the Tarbabes in the dashes and relay.
