

White Stars At Chaffey

Isaac Curtis was supposed to be the "Glamor Boy" of the Santa Ana track team this year. As the defending CIF low hurdle champion, he was the man who was to make the Saints contenders for the CIF championship in 1969.

But Curtis has been shelved almost the entire track season with an assortment of injuries. He may not even be healthy when the CIF competition begins in early May.

However, Santa Ana may still be a contender for the CIF championship. And the man who could win it for the Saints is junior sprinter Jackie White.

It was White who salvaged the day for Santa Ana at the 40th annual Chaffey Invitational Track meet Saturday with

impressive wins in the 100 and 220, stamping himself as one of the CIF's top dashmen.

White was only one of the meet's standouts. He had to share top billing with Anaheim's Tom Keefer and Compton's Olympian, Reynaldo Brown.

Brown, as expected, shattered his own meet record in the highjump when he soared over the bar at 6-10. Still getting into shape after starring on the Tarabes CIF championship basketball team, Brown didn't miss a jump until he reached 6-10.

He scrapped off the bar on his first try at the winning height, but cleared it easily on the second attempt. He then moved the bar to 7-0, but failed to clear it in three tries.

Keefer led an assault on Den-

nis Carr's mile record 4:21.1. Redland's Richard Kash shattered Carr's mark with a 4:16.4 in the first race. He held the meet record for less than five minutes — the time it took Keefer to step on the track and breeze to a 4:14.6 clocking.

It was Keefer's fast time of the year, and is second in the CIF to only Decker Underwood's 4:13.8 run in the recent Southern Counties.

Garden Grove's Tony Krzyzosiak marked himself as one of Orange County's future stars. The sophomore speedster sped to a 35.0 in the novice 330 to break the meet record set by Tustin's Gary Walker in 1958. Krzyzosiak also won the novice longjump at 21-8.

White, who was gunning for the meet record of 9.7, looked like he had a new record when he captured the century. He was awarded an "unofficial" 9.5 after beating Compton's Alvin Dashiell, but the official timers disagreed and gave White a 9.8.

The Santa Ana speedster returned in the 220 to post an "official" 21.3. He appeared to be struggling through the first 100 yards, but after passing the midway point he shifted into high gear and won easily.

Santa Ana's Monty Floyd tied the meet record in the novice 120 yard hurdles with a 13.2. Teammate Dan Lindsay finished second. They traded places in the novice 70 yard high hurdles.

La Habra's Ruben Mejia opened the meet with an easy win in the two-mile, cruising the eight laps in 9:28.3.

Santa Ana Valley had the dubious distinction of winning the same race twice in the trial heats during the morning, but failing to make the afternoon finals.

In the 440 relay, the Falcons got overanxious and ran 43.5 in third heat. But they were entered in the fourth heat, not the third, so they had to run again. They won the second time, but were later disqualified for passing out of lane.

The oldest record in the Chaffey recordbooks was finally beaten when Santa Fe's Randy Fulkerson jumped 6-3½ in the novice high jump to better the mark set by Santa Ana's Blas Mercurio in 1934.
