In the first 36 years of the Foothill League between 1930-65, sprinters from the league won 16 CIF 100-yard dash titles (44 percent) and 8 State championships. From 1961 through 1965, Foothill League sprinters won all 5 CIF titles and 3 State 100-yard dashes.

Muir athletes won the 100-yard dash 14 times followed by Hoover with 12. Of Muir's titles 8 came between 1963 and 1971.

Six athletes were two-time champions – John Bradley, Hoover (1947-48); Don Romano, Montebello (1954-55); Forrest Beaty, Hoover (1960, 1962); Harold Busby, Muir (1964-65); Randy Simmrin, Burroughs (1973-74); and Dwaine Ball, Blair (1975-76). Beaty missed a chance at being the only 3-time winner when he was upset as a junior by Burroughs' Ralph Turner.



Hoover's **Milton "Dubby" Holt** won Foothill League 100 in 1932, along with CIF and State titles. Holt had finished 2nd in 1930 and 3rd in 1931. He went on to sprint at Fresno State and Idaho State before becoming longtime athletic director and coach at Idaho State. He won 13 consecutive conference titles as the Bengals track coach, won 2 national titles as boxing coach and coached the United States boxing team at the 1956 Olympics. The school's indoor football and basketball facility formerly named the Minidome is now Holt Arena.



Muir's **George Anderson** was the 1933 Foothill League 100 champ and also won CIF and State meets at that distance. Anderson also won 2 State 220 titles in 1932 and 1933, as well as being the CIF 220 champ in 1933. He attended California, where in 1935 won the IC4A 100-meters in 10.7, finished 3rd in the NCAA 100 and fourth in the AAU 100. That same year he was 2nd in IC4A 200-meters, 2nd in the NCAA 220 and tied for 2nd in AAU 200-meters.





Muir's **Mack Robinson** went from winning the Foothill League 100 and long jump in 1934 to winning a silver medal in the 1936 Olympics finishing 2nd in the 200-meters at 21.1. Robinson, older brother of Jackie, won the 1938 NCAA 200-meters competing for Oregon.

Montebello's **Don Romano** won 100 in 1954 and 100 and 220 in 1955 and then competed at Mt.SAC.
