Track and Field News

Ithaca, N.Y., Feb 22 — Harvard won the Heptagonal Championships (Ivy League plus Army and Navy) this evening, ending a three-year spell in which the Crimson consistently came to the Heps, indoors and outdoors, long on talent but, in the end, short on the points needed to win. Although the Cantabs have as many nationally prominent athletes as the rest of the teams here put together, they just edged Army $55\frac{1}{2}-51\frac{1}{2}$, to gain their first Hep track title since the indoor meet of 1966.

The outstanding individual effort of the EEE meet was the brilliant 2-mile of Harvard's included bearded Doug Hardin, whose last lap spring (220 in 28.1) carried him to an 8:48.6 victory over Princeton's Eamon Downey (8:51.4) and Yale's Frank Shorter (8:52.6). Shorter had led the entire race through the 1 3/4 but was unable to hold off Hardin's kick and, in the last 60 yards, was passed by Downey as well.

Royce Shaw led a 1-2-3 Crimson a sweep in the mile with a sluggish 4:12.6 while teammate Keith Colburn came off a slow pace to take the 1000 in 2:12.6. Harvard also won both throwing events with Dick Benka (57-4 shot) and soph Ed Nosal(60-3 35 1b wt). The latter came through with under great pressure as the usually reliable Charlie Ajootian failed to qualify for the final in the 35, after finishing second in the shot.

The Cadets were led by juniors Bruce Peltier and Bruce Olson, both of whom jumped career bests of 6-10. Peltier won on fewer misses.
