

FIVE RECORDS FALL IN U.S. JUNIOR MEET

Ronda Brady of the Mayor Hatcher Youth Foundation barely edged Sonya Hardy of the Boulder Cinderbells to win the 100-meter hurdles in the National AAU Junior women's track and field championships at UCLA Tuesday.

Both Brady, who was timed in a meet-record 13.53, and Hardy, who finished in 13.54, bettered the Olympic qualifying standard of 13.64.

Cathy Crawford of the Central Jersey TC bettered the qualifying standard of 11.64 in the 100 meters by winning in 11.61.

Other meet records were set by Debbie Quatier of the Falcon TC in the 1,500 (4:22.5), Debbie Esser of Iowa State in the 400 hurdles (58.34), the Atoms Track Club in the mile relay (3:41.9) and Kathy Devine of Emporia State in the shot put (50-7).

The first two finishers in each event qualify for an international tour, including a dual meet with the USSR.
