U.S. Junior National Championships

June 24-25. Florida State University, Tallahassee, FL.

A super crew from California and across the country turned out for the 1994 Junior National Championships at Florida State University in late June. The Meet is open to athletes who will not turn 20 during this year of competition (those born 1975 or later for 1994) who meet a certain time standard. Great fields showed up for this qualifier for the World Junior Championships in Lisbon, Portugal, in mid-July. Californians were very, very prominent, with an impressive ten wins by California natives or athletes representing California Universities. It was a great weekend for the sport under what turned out to some quite challenging circumstances on Friday with quite a bit of rain (though it was eighty degrees out with the rain falling!). Saturday was described by locals as the best weather

in years for a June Sunday, with 75 degrees and cloudy conditions that were perfect!

Speedsters and hurdlers from the Golden State were very significant factors in most of those events here. Friday evening's 100 meter finals were run in eighty degree rain, with the Women's race in a very driving storm. Philadelphia Deworski Odom was right at home in the Men's event, taking it at 10.51, with Southern Californians Bryan Howard third at 10.60 and Pat Johnson fourth at 10.61. The next day over 200 meters, under better conditions, Bryan was 2nd to NCAA third placer Tony Wheeler (Clemson-20.67) with a fine 20.80, with Johnson next at 21.07. Both the Californians were placed on the World Junior Championship squad, with both competing for the U.S. 400 meter relay baton squad, and Bryan in the 200.

The Women's 100 meter event was run in a driving rain, with Aminah Haddad and LaKeisha Backus probably wondering what the heck they were doing at the starting line under such conditions! Floridan Sabrina Herring-Kelly took the run at 11.55, with the thoroughly drenched Haddad 5th and Backus 7th. The next day over 200 meters Backus was 2nd to Aspen Burkett 23.54-23.62, with Haddad 4th at 23.86. Backus was named to the U.S. team over the 200 meter distance. Haddad can take solace in the

fact that she was two years younger than any of the 100 or 200 meter finalists with her 1978 birthdate. East St. Louis's Cicely Scott of UCLA was second to Monique Hennagan over 400 meters 52.19-53.15 to qualify for the individual event and 4x400 relay team.

Prep Coke Edmon shocked with a perfect 400 meter hurdle race, placing a very impressive third at 51.81 at a distance he certainly had not run many times. Only Charles White (51.5-1976) and Rich Greybehl (51.6-1974) have ever run faster among Golden State preps! Very hot competition headlined the Women's 100 meter barrier event, with Latasha Colander, winner of April's Arcadia/Foot Locker event racing 13.36 (#4 AT HS), with Bay area rivals Bisa Grant (13.83-3rd) and super frosh Daveetta Shepherd (13.86-4th) competing very strongly. Angela Harris, hoping to make the U.S. Junior team, came so, so close, racing a fine 58.93, but only placing third behind super eighth grader Char Foster (57.98 a world age 14 record), and Yvonne Harrison (Odessa JC, Texas), who ran easily her best race of the year at 58.88. Harris will go on to UNLV and should be a super collegiate long sprinter and one lap hurdler for the Lady Rebels. Joanna Hayes was seventh in the short hurdles.

Ninth grader Julia Stamps continued the famed start to her prep career, here over 3000 meters against a top group. Sarna Renfro, national prep mile (4:46.98) and 3200m (10:19.5) leader, Rosy Gardner, 4:48.80 (mi) and 10:25.78 (3200m at altitude), and a flock of fast Collegians would test the California State 3200m champ. All had in mind that they had to run a World Junior Championship standard 9:35.0 for the seven and a half-lap event to compete in that Championship meet, with the first two from this race selected for the U.S. team. After a 5:07 opening 1600m, a 79 second lap put the group behind qualifying pace, with the alert

Gardner pushing the sixth lap at 75 seconds, with Renfro and Stamps the only ones close behind. Building up with a 72 second seventh lap, the contest came down to as exciting a last 250 meters as one will see in a quality distance race. Gardner, with a long, "up on her toes" powerful stride, and the long, powerful striding Renfro, were joined by the short and economically striding Stamps for the last half lap sprint. Amazingly the fifteen year old Californian edged by both around the final turn, holding off the PAC-10 bound twosome (Renfro to Stanford - Gardner to Oregon), with Stamps the winner at 9:28.50, Renfro 9:28.95, and Gardner 9:31.99 in third. Very sadly only two could make the team with all three so deserving. Gardner was very gracious in defeat, with Rosy a sure big-time star at Oregon along with Milena Glusac and crew. Stamps set a national frosh record with her time!!

Frosh Miesha Marzell (Georgetown via Bishop O'Dowd of Oakland) helped put the finishing touches on a sterling frosh season with a 4:23.97 1500m win that handled some pretty hot prep athletes. Marzell's 4:23.97 barely made the World Jr Standard of 4:24.0. State 800 Meter Champion Kristie Johnson took a big step up here, with Jawauna McMullen dragging the pack out at 59 seconds for the first lap in the final, with Johnston in last at under 62 seconds. Kristie showed real toughness in racing a lifetime best of 2:08.93 for fourth place behind McMullen's 2:05.95.

Field eventers represented California nicely! Suzy Powell continued her magical twelfth grade discus season, looking ahead to the World Juniors and a high placing after taking the event here by over twenty feet at 172-11. UCLA frosh Amy Acuff took the High Jump in probably close to the worse weather conditions a field ever had to face, clearing 5-8 in a driving Friday rain. Jeremy Fischer also finished out his prep career with a big win, taking the High Jump at 7-2 1/2 (better Saturday conditions!). Fischer evened a score with Eric Bishop of Georgia, the only prep to defeat Jeremy this year--in the National Scholastic Indoor Meet (it took a 7-4 1/2 leap to do it!). Scott Slover impressively took the Pole Vault at 16-4 3/4 in some rainy Friday weather.

Californians swept the two team positions in the Decathlon, with Russ Bomben (6863) and super Azusa Pacific frosh (via Arizona), Tage Peterson (6851), with the duo overcoming some pretty horrendous conditions. Kerry O'Bric was the youngest in the Women's Heptathlon field, with her 4374 great experience for the three more years she has of "Junior-age" eligibility.

Stanford red-shirt frosh via South Dakota, Greg Jimmerson, took the 10,000 on Friday at 30:33.24, then the 5000 the next evening at 14:39.06. Ray Butman, two years out of high-school, from the Alta Loma area, took the Steeplechase at 9:13.23, and showed some real potential in the event. Mark Hauser, University of Wisconsin bound, raced one of the year's fastest prep 1500's with a 3:52.28 for fourth place.

Justin Marrujo of Temecula added a win in the Men's 10,000 Meter racewalk at 46:40.31, with the auto trip to Florida (yes the family drove!) complete with a tow-job in the middle of the New Mexico desert.

The 1995 Junior Nationals will be in the Los Angeles area in late June, with the meet the qualifier for the Pan-

American Junior Championships in the sport. Information on the 1995 Meet will be placed in *California Track News* when it is available this coming winter.
