Cross, Normal, who won two firsts and who also helped win the relay, broke the state record by one-fourth. Inch in the broad jump, leaping 22 feet 11-4 inches. Cassidy, who won all Ottawa's points, raised the record on pole vault to 11 feet 31-4 inches. Stiles, Normal, threw the javelin 170 feet, adding 12 feet 61-2 inches to the old record.
