Two Marks For Richardson.

Ottawa's winning total was the highest score ever amassed in a conference meet and ended a 9-year reign of Baker university. The Braves chalked up eight firsts, tied for two others, and placed in every event but the 2-mile run. Casida won high individual honors with 14 points, winning the low hurdles and broad jump and tying for first in the high jump. Don Kimble, C. of E. captain, was second with 12. He set a new conference discus record at 148 feet, 8 inches, tied for first in the high jump and placed second in the broad jump.

Jack Richardson, Ottawa's freshman sprinter, was clocked in 21 5-10 seconds in the 220 to displace the former mark of 21 6-10 held by Gene Parrow, of Baker. Fred Ghrist of Baker nosed out Bob Hopkins in both distance events, winning the mile by a scant yard and the 2-mile by a thin whisker. Keezel. of Ottawa, came from behind to eke out Carey, C. of E. in a closely contested 880. Casida scored a questionable victory over George Fullington in the low hundles.

In addition to Kimble's performances, C. of E. could garner only two first places. Ernic Cipra won the javelin at 174 feet and Fullington took the high hurdles in 15 9-10 seconds. Kimble, Cipra and Fullington, as well as Clarence George, who placed in both distance events, and Gerald Meek, second place winner in the discus, ended their competitive carrers for C. of E. in the meet.
