

Track Championship Is Won by C. of E.

Presbyterians Score 47 Points to
Wig Kansas Conference Meet
At Ottawa — Wesleyan Sec-
ond With 36½.

STAGES STRONG FINISH

C. of E. Places in Javelin and
Wins Relay and Broad Jump
To Amass Winning Total—
One Record Broken.

Ottawa, May 22 (P)—College of
Emporia lived up to advance notices
and annexed the Kansas conference
track and field championship here
Friday, scoring 47 points. Kansas
Wesleyan of Salina was second with
36½. Other scores: Baker 34, Ot-
tawa 25½, McPherson 12 and Beth-
any 10.

Individual honors, however, went
to Clyde Warner, Kansas Wesleyan
sprinter, who won both the 100 and
220-yard dashes. The only new rec-
ord established came when Asa
Eagles, Ottawa, hurled the javelin
204 feet, seven inches, to better his
own mark of 194 feet.

C. of E. won only four firsts but
annexed a flock of seconds, thirds
and fourths to pile up its winning
total. Marshall won the half mile
run in 2 minutes .7 second and Bob
Waxson the discus at 126 feet 7
inches to aid in sending C. of E.
into the fast three events trailing
Kansas Wesleyan by only half a
point. Walt Newland took second
and Reuben Harzman fourth in the
javelin to put Emporia into the lead
and Cliff Rock clinched matters by
leaping 20 feet 10½ inches to win
the broadjump. Emporia's mile re-
lay team of Osborne, Carey, Mar-
shall and McNickle then boosted the
C. of E. total by 5 points by winning
this event.

The track was heavy and rain fell
during part of the meet.

Golf honors, individual and team,
went to Ottawa. Kenneth Hill, Wel-
lington, of Ottawa, shot 213 for
medal honors, and a team mate,

George von Arb of Kansas City, was
but one stroke behind.

Baker annexed tennis laurels
when Earl Bramble won the singles
title by defeating Junior Shaw,
Kansas Wesleyan, 6-0, 8-3, and then
teamed with Everett Rebb to win
the doubles from Carl Monson and
Maurice Lysell of Bethany 8-4, 8-4.
Rain forced matches to be played in-
doors.
