Defending champion Southwestern retained its team title, as expected, with 103 points, followed by Ottawa with 83 2-3, College of Emporia 72, Baker 54 1-3, Kansas Wesleyan 38, Bethel 28, Sterling 27, McPherson 25, Baker 20 and Friends 13.
