With 2nd 7

STERLING — Southwestern
College somewhat startled its
Kansas Conference challengers
here Thursday by flexing a few
muscles to go along with its usaul fly-away speed and easily won
a second consecutive conference
track championship.
Backed by all-out efforts in the
morning's preliminaries and later on the field events for a wide
early margin, the Builders blew
by the rest of the competition
with a grand point total of 134.
Ottawa University rode the
Southwestern wake with 38 1-3
points, and struggled to head off
Friends, 81, and inspired Sterling, 77, in a see-saw battle for
what was left.
Southwestern won five events in

what was left.

Southwestern won five events in all, while Friends captured four, and OU, Sterling, and Bake rook two each.

Ottawa's gold medals were won by Jim Roth in the discus and Darrel Randall in the mile run. Randall added a second place in the two-mile, and other medal winners for the Braves were Leonard Scheufler, second in the 330-yard intermediate hurdles and third in the highlurdles, and Dan Griffin, a tie for second in the pole vault,

Southwestern's team hook-up produced a 53-34 1-3 bulge over Ottawa following the field events, and it was never in doubt from there on, hu the field, the Builders won the javelin and high jump, added a third in the spear throw, and then a 2-3 finish in the shot put — literally silicing OUs not seen at fashion of power in the same events.

The Builders claimed 12 qualifiers in the preliminaries, while
Ottawa had 10 for seven running
events. In the evening, Southwestern kept right on showing cinder
dust to most everyone, winning
the 440-yard relay and the 100yard dash, but the real clincher
came with a 12-2 sweep in the
440-yard run.
If OU's Braves weren't entirely out of it after the off-beat
resuits of the field events, they
certainly were when it came to
the all-Important sprints.
Southwestern's Adrian Miller
flew to the 100 title, while Ottawa's Wendell Carpenter fell
back to sixth and Phil Hughes,
the defending champion and winer of a preliminary heat, pulled
up lame.

Hughes, plagued by a pulled muscle the past two weeks, reportedly had injured his good leg three events earlier in the 440 relay. After the 100, he then scratched from the 220, in which he had breezed to an easy 21,7 clocking in the prelims—the best time of the meet.

Scheufler's time in the 330-yard hurdles, 39,6, was a new OU record, breaking his own mark of 40,0, set in 1965. Randail ran the mile in 4:26.8, one of his best.

Two records fell in the KCAC running, Duane Gabrielson of Baker lowered the high hurdle mark to 14,65, and the Friends' mile relay squad churned the distance in 3:22.2. Harold Rush of Friends also tied his own intermediate hurdle record, 38.7.

Rush was the meet's outstanding individual, scoring 40 points. He had gold medals in the broad jump and 330 hurdles, took second in the triple jump and high hurdles, and ran legs on the 440 and mile relays.

Besides Miller, who added the anchor on the victorious 440 relay and a second in the 220 to his 100-yard triumph, Southwestern was sparked by gutty little Keith Dial. Dial barreled his way to victory in the 440 dash, third in the 220, and ran on both relays. Serling's surprising fourth-place finish was supplied mainly by Charles Haspels and Terry Woodbury. Haspels nudged Rush
