

SLINGER DUNN TWICE WINNER

*Huge Youth Hurls Discus
a Mere 157 Feet*

*Also Captures Shot in Meet
at Long Beach*

*Marty Defeats Toribio in
the High Jump*

Gordon (Slinger) Dunn, a mammoth young man from Stanford, hogged the limelight at Long Beach yesterday by winning both shot and discus from a field of formidable opponents. The occasion was the annual A.A.U. relay meet, which included an extensive program of baton-passing events which was run off like clockwork by officials of the thriving beach metropolis.

Weighing 240 pounds and standing well over six feet tall, the Slinger first wrapped his huge paw around the saucer and sailed it 157ft. 3 3-4in. for a new meet record. Not only did Dunn win the event but in doing so enjoyed the distinction of defeating none other than John Anderson, the handsome ex-Cornell athlete, who was crowned Olympic Games champion here last August.

DRAMA CALLS HIM

Unable to take much time for practice from his dramatic studies, Anderson did only 152ft. yesterday, just ten feet shy of his throw in the Olympics. Ordinarily 152ft. would win most any meet, but not with the Slinger around.

Later on in the afternoon Dunn fussed around with the shot long enough to beat Houston Harper of Southern California. Dunn did 48ft. 3in., while Harper's best toss measured 47ft. 7 3-8in. Harper, who is sometimes called "Hippo" because of his looks or size, was made to appear like a little boy alongside of Dunn.

Next fall the two will probably glare at each other across the line of scrimmage, for both are tackles. Dunn become eligible with the dawn of a new semester at Stanford the first of April. He has done 50ft. 10in. in the shot, while his throw in the discus yesterday was the best he ever uncorked. Dunn prepped at Mendocino Jaymeet but has been training under Dinkus Templeton's watchful eye of late—and acts like it. He is bad news to the Trojans' track hopes.

It was a rather sad day for Olympic champions all around. Walter Marty, the Fresno lad who failed to make the American Olympic team, trimmed both Simeon Toribio and Bob Van Oedel, third and second last summer, in the high jump. Duncan McNaughton, Olympic winner, did not compete. Marty set a new meet record of 6ft. 4 7-8in.

Toribio was the only leaper to give the Fresno boy any kind of competition. Van Oedel arrived late, started jumping without sufficient time to warm up and passed out of the picture in a hurry.

Bill Graber, not an Olympic champ, but the world record-holder, likewise found the going too tough in the pole vault and was eliminated at 12ft. 6in.

SEFTON, HALLETT TIE

Bill Sefton, ex-Poly High boy, and Jack Hallett, the fair-haired boy of Occidental, went on from where Graber left off and ultimately tied for first at 13ft. It was pretty windy for pole vaulting and, after trying to buck the gale for an hour or so, the boys turned around and vaulted with the wind.

Malcolm Metcalf, winner of the American tryouts in the javelin last summer, successfully defended his position with a throw of 210ft. The former Dartmouth athlete had little trouble out-boosting Bud Sample of Arizona, who did 198ft.

The novice 100-meter run

provided a lot of excitement when George Anderson, State interscholastic champion at 220 yards, blazed through to victory in the sensational time of 18.4s. Inasmuch as the world record stood at this figure for a long time and Eddie Tolan was only able to knock it down by one-tenth of a second last summer, there was much lifting of eyebrows when Anderson's time was announced. After several hours of uncertainty the track was measured and, to the horror of everybody, was found to be four meters short of the required distance. At any rate, Anderson is a good runner.

Cotton Warburton, Troy's grid-iron flea, tried his dogs out in the same race, but had to be content with fifth place. Cotton would no doubt have led the parade by several yards had somebody placed a porkhide in his hands.

There were several dozen relay races, the most exciting of which saw Dave Foore come from behind to nip Ron Johnson at the tape for first honors in the four-man two-mile grind.
