

# Trojans Run Off With Long Beach Relays

Leroy Weed Turns Mile in 4m. 15.8s.  
as Hal Davis Captures Century

LONG BEACH, March 21.—Those high and mighty Southern California Trojan tracksters again walked off with most of the silverware and gold plate at the annual Long Beach Relays as seven records of one denomination or another fell and another was tied.

While the official statisticians gave up attempting to score team figures early in the afternoon, Coach Dean Cromwell's thin-clad army won from here to there since California, Stanford and U.C.L.A. contributed only a handful of performers and the Olympic Club failed to show up.

## DUELS COLLAPSE

The result was that such expected duels as Cliff Bourland and Hubie Kerns of Troy against Grover Klemmer of California in the open quarter and Hal Davis, Golden Bear speedster, against the Trojan dash men in the open century failed to materialize.

Klemmer was unable to compete because of a pulled leg muscle and Coach Cromwell pulled his dash men out of the hundred to save them for the relay races.

## RELAY RECORD

Two record performances highlighted the day. The Southern California quarter-mile baton-passing quartet broke an 11-year-old mark when Eddie Morris, Jack Trout, Kerns and Bourland turned in a sparkling 41.7s. race which clipped 1/10 of a second from the one put on the books by another great Trojan team anchored by Frankie Wykoff.

The other important contribution to the day's efforts came in the invitational mile which Leroy Weed of Troy won with great ease in the fine early season time of 4m. 15.8s. This eliminated the record made by Marston Girard of the Olympic Club last year when he won in 4m. 19.7s. The Trojan was 50 feet in front of Art Cazares of Fresno State at the tape.

## AUDET SHINES

A prospective Trojan, Earl Audet, who transferred from Georgetown University, hoisted the 16-pound shot out 53ft. 3in., better than a foot beyond the meet mark posted two years ago by Stan Anderson from Stanford. He conquered a varsity field that included Troy's Carl Merritt, who wound up second with 48ft. 3 1/4 in., and Bob Biles of California, who had a best heave of 47ft. 7 1/4 in.

Bob Likens, the Glendale J.C. spearman, set a new national junior college record of 200ft. 1 1/4 in. to beat the best university men but he was 25-odd feet short of Bob Peoples' meet record.

Other marks included two posted in the high school events in

the morning when Glendale surprised everyone by collecting twice as many unofficial team points as Woodrow Wilson of Long Beach, the prep favorite.

Jackie Waddell, from Visalia J.C., cleared 13ft. 4in. to hoist the Class B pole vault standard an inch and Louis Futtrell of Fresno State captured the novice high hurdles race in 14.9s. to tie that mark.

## HURDLE UPSET

The open 120-yard hurdle event brought an upset when Dick Kinzie of Arizona State defeated such stars as John Blewener of S.C., last year's victor and record-holder; Lee Angelich of California and Ed Hertel of Stanford in 14.5s.

Individual high-point man of the day was Bill Smith, the former Belmont High star now with San Jose State. He tied with Gil Greene of Troy for first in the high jump at 6ft. 5in. tied again with Dick Fordham of Los Angeles City Colleg. in the broad jump at 21ft. 1/2in. and then finished third behind Davis and Payton Jordan of the Southern California A.A. in the open 100.

## DAVIS TRIUMPHS

Smith was leading 10 strides from the tape but Davis came on with his famous closing rush to win by a yard with Jordan only inches ahead of the Negro youth. The time of 9.6s. was 2-10ths short of Clyde Jeffrey's meet record.

One of the most amazing performances of the day came in the four-man, half-mile relay in which Troy hoped to set another record. On the first baton exchange Morris dropped the stick. He must have lost four seconds in picking it up again as the field sped 40 yards into the lead.

But Morris and the next two Trojans, Dick Browning and Bourland, closed the gap to win by yards over the Trojan fresh four in 1m. 39.9s. Otherwise they might have bested the mark in 1m. 27.2s. set by the Trojans in 1937.
