Flyer in 9.4s. Dash

Lloyd La Beach, the Jamaica flyer who'll likely represent Panama in the Olympic Games, streaked to a 9.4s. 100-yard dash to equal the world's record in the Long Beach Relays at Woodrow Wilson High School yesterday.

While the mark will be accepted as tying the meet record which Clyde Jeffrey of Stanford set in 1940, an application for a world mark will not be made. Reason is that Starter Kinter Hamilton said La Beach got a rolling start and his recall gun failed to fire.

Breeze Light

However, Assistant Starter C. G. Sedgwick said he didn't recall the start because he thought La Beach did not get away before the gun.

As for wind velocity the meter registered 2.5 m.p.h., within the three-mile limit for a record. Experts figured La Beach picked up a 10th of a second with his moving start.

A few minutes after La Beach's startling performance it began to drizzle, and after several races were run in the rain, the SC and LAAC teams withdrew. They were followed by most of the lesser teams.

The remainder of the meet was run off, but the unofficial team scoring was completely disrupted.

High Hurdle Dual

Another feature in the early events was the renewal of the high hurdles duel between Craig Dixon of UCLA and Al Lawrence, former Trojan now competing for the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Dixon won by three yards in the exceedingly fast time of 14.4s., which equaled the meet standard set by SC's John Biewener in 1941.

The open mile went to Trojan Roland Sink who out kicked Eugene Haynes of San Jose State on the last lap and hit the tape with a 20-yard margin. His time was a creditable 4m. 19.4s.

Close Finish

Closest finish of the open division was in the mile relay in which the LAAC nosed out the Trojans in a two-team race. The teams ran within five yards of each other all the way. On the anchor lap Wells De Loach of the Trojans made up three yards on the Mercury's anchor man, John Fulton, but couldn't quite catch him. The time was a speedy 3m. 18.7s.

Steve Seymour of the LAAC started his season with a 206ft. toss in winning the javelin.

Even with the sloppy conditions five leapers managed to struggle over 6ft. 3in. to tie for first in the high jump.

Overhouse Victor

Some rangy discus throwing saw Ray Overhouse of San Jose State win out with a 132ft. 7in. heave, and Edsel Curry of SC turned in a fine 23ft. 2in. hop to win in the broad jump. Big Jim Delaney, the only entry from the San Francisco Olympic Club, took the shot-put at 53ft. 2¼ in. to better the fine 52ft. 6in. heave by Trojan Bill Bayless.

Los Angeles City College took the jaycee sprint relays, copping the four-man 440 chase in 43.7s. and the four-man mile affair in 3m. 28.5s.

Aztecs Nipped

Pepperdine nosed out San Diego State in a hair-raising college division mile relay in the speedy time of 3m. 23.1s.

The high school class produced several outstanding performances. Half Miler Jim Walters of Compton was clocked in 1m. 58.2s. in anchoring his winning two-mile team, but his effort went for naught when the Tarabes were disqualified for an illegal baton pass.

Bill Storum of Beverly Hills brought down the high hurdle record from 15.7s. to 15.1s. Husky
