

UCLA and Oxy Runners Take Relay Honors

UCLA's well-balanced crew of sprinters and Occidental's stellar middle-distance stars ran away with honors yesterday in the 18th renewal of the Long Beach Relay Carnival at the new Long Beach Memorial Stadium.

Some 7500 fans, and more than 1100 athletes, waited out a program that started before noon and was barely completed by dusk.

Twin Victories

Record-breaking was at an absolute minimum in the open division, partly due to an 11.5-m.p.h. wind that blew in the faces of the sprinters and hurdlers and unquestionably affected some field events. By late afternoon it was a very chilly wind, too.

UCLA's Bobby Work, back in collegiate good graces after a year of ineligibility, captured the open century—the Charles Paddock 100—in 10.1s., about a yard and a half ahead of Teammate Rod Richard.

And the two of them participated in a pair of relay victories, the four-man 440 and the four-man 880. Their teammates in each case were Bob Watanabe and George Brown.

No Anchor, He

Occidental would have made quite a bid for the team title if any point score had been maintained because the Tigers not only annexed the other two relays, the four-man mile and four-man two mile, but twice finished second to the Bruins.

And Oxy's Bob McMillen, considered a near cinch to break his own meet mark of 4m. 15.3s. in the mile, won that event easily even if his time of 4m. 21.5s was a disappointment. He was

also a member of the winning two-mile relay combine.

John Barnes, Oxy's great half-miler, anchored both the Tiger victories, the mile quartet beating Stanford by 25 yards in 3m. 19.7s, and the two-mile gang trimming UCLA by 20 yards in 7m. 55.5s. with both Barnes and McMillen turning in half-miles around the 1m. 55s. mark. Wilbur Cotrel, Hal Butler, Walt McKibben and Ted Ruprecht were the other members of the Oxy teams.

Vaulting Deadlock

Southern California's NCAA champs, making their debut under Jesse Mortensen, were slightly less than sensational.

Art Barnard, won the high hurdles for Troy in an airtight finish with Don Hildreth of Arizona State (Tempe) in 15.1s.

Jack Rowan gave SC another first-place meral with his 13ft. 6in. pole vault. He actually tied with Bob Smith of San Diego State and Ray Kring of the Olympic Club but had fewer misses at that height.

Many of the Trojan runners, not yet in peak condition, were limited to sketchy relay appearances. Jim Newcomb skipped the open mile but did two laps in 2m. flat in the relay.

Field event marks were almost uniformly disappointing.

Chandler Wins

Otis Chandler of the Olympic Club won the shot at 52ft. 1in.; Sim Iness of LAAC the discus at 158ft. 3in.; Cy Young of LAAC the javelin at 219ft. 2in.; George Brown of UCLA the broad jump at 23ft. 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. and Jack Razzeto of San Diego the high jump at 6ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

No open marks fell but San Diego set a 3m. 21.6s. four-man mile record in the college class and a San Diego high school boy, Clyde Wetler, hurled the 12-pound shot 56ft. 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. for Grossmont High to boost the mark 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

Some star entrants had varying mishaps. Les Laing of Fresno State didn't show for the 100, having pulled a muscle Thursday. Bill Albans, Oxy's ineligible decathlon star, was left at his marks in the hurdles and quit before even clearing the first barrier in his heat. Hugo Nutini, the Chilean miler, spilled on the second lap when he caught his foot on the inner rail and hurt his ankle. A Bruin discus thrower, John Pennino, was cut on the leg when hit by a flying disc.
