

Marks Tumble, but '64 Olympic Hopefuls Lag

The road to Tokyo is a long one and apparently most of the Southland's track and field stars aren't in a hurry to get started.

The 23rd annual Long Beach Relays Saturday was notable by its conspicuous lack of big-name athletes (Dallas Long, Ulla Williams, Rex Cowley, Ralph Boston, Rink Babka, et al.) and the comparatively lack-luster performances of those who did compete.

Record-wise, with 28 new ones in five divisions of competition, it was a successful meet, but not a headline-catching one. With 1,600 athletes competing and another 1,600 in the stands, the crowd count rose to 3,200 at Veterans Memorial Stadium for the first major outdoor meet of an Olympic year.

Hefty Javelin Toss

Frank Covelli, who won last year's NCAA javelin at 257 ft. 8 1/2 in. for Arizona State, did even better Saturday, but his 260-7 gem escaped attention. It was done at nearby Long Beach State, out of view of spectators.

The old record holder, USC's Larry Stuart, exceeded his old mark (247-11) with a 249-7 throw, but got only third place. Fourth was former world's record holder Bud Held at 238-7, creditable for a 36-year-old.

Camp Pendleton, with ex-Colorado star Jim Heath running a 46.8 anchor lap, upset Henry Carr-anchored Arizona State in a 3:11.2 mile relay. The surprising Marines also won the sprint medley relay and the shot put with hulking Dave Davis' 59-ft. effort in the absence of Long and Parry O'Brien.

Two-Man Race

Most colorful race was the 3-mile in which 68 runners broke from the starting line. It quickly became a two-man race, however, with Pan-American Games champion Jeff Fishback beating USC sophomore Sterling Jenkins in a record 13:52.4 clocking.

Dennis Carr, interscholastic record holder in both the 880 and mile, made an auspicious big-meet debut as a USC freshman by anchoring three winning relay teams. Carr's best time was a 1:51.6 leg in the distance medley.

Henry Strides

Another Carr, Arizona State's Henry, staved a 46.5 quarter-mile in a futile effort to catch the Marines' Heath and Striders' Don Webster.

Other open records included a 9.7 hundred by Jamaican Pablo McNeil, a student at Compton College; a 9:33.6 distance medley relay by UCLA (Gerry Mavrinac, 49.7; Dennis Breckow, 1:32.2; Earl Clibborn, 3:06.1; Bob Day, 4:05.6); a 171-9 discus throw by New Zealand's Les Mills, now of USC; a 41.1-440 relay by Fresno State, anchored by Darel Newman, the controversial 60 yd. dash conqueror of Bob Hayes, in the Long Beach Indoor Games; a 1:24.9 880 relay by the Striders, with Adolph Plummer in a 20.4 anchor; a 49-9 1/4 triple jump by Fresno State's Charles Craig and a 15-5 pole vault by C. K. Yang.
