

Mile relay triumph gives WM track title

OXFORD, Ohio (AP) — Western Michigan's young mile relay foursome finished second in the final event Saturday to bring the Broncos from behind for their first Mid-American Conference track title in five years.

Western Michigan trailed Eastern Michigan by five points going into the closing relay. The Broncos' second place slipped them by the Hurons with 110 points to 107.

Eastern Michigan, failing to score a point in the closing event in the three-day meet in Miami Stadium, held onto to second place, however.

DEFENDING CHAMPION Kent State finished third with 90 points, Bowling Green was fourth with 72 1-3 and Central Michigan fifth with 70. Then came Ohio University with 64, Miami with 60, Ball State with 40 2-3, Northern Illinois 20 and Toledo 16.

The Broncos' depth, along with four first places, returned Western Michigan to the dominance it enjoyed over the conference a decade ago. Western won 13 of 14 MAC track championships, beginning in 1958.

"Our mile relay knew what it had to do. I didn't have to say anything to them. We weren't that worried about Eastern Michigan," said Western Coach Jack Shaw.
