Flooded

Rain wiped out finals in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference track and field championships Sunday at Dover, Del., and spelled defeat in the 120-yard high hurdles for Charles Foster of North Carolina Central.

Foster was defeated by Maurice Raeford of Morgan State in Saturday's semifinals and never had a chance to atone for the letdown. Raeford won in 13.8 seconds. Foster is the world's No. 1-ranked amateur hurdler.

Host Delaware State, the favorite for the team title, was declared champion based on one final — the discus — and results of eight semifinals. Uncompleted and not counting in the team standings were the mile, mile relay, 2-mile, 440 relay, pole vault, javelin, shot put and high jump.

Maryland-Eastern Shore's George Neal threw 149-6 to best Wayne Brzoska of Delaware State by 11 inches in the discus.

DSC's George Early won the long jump, Walt Tulis won the 100-yard dash and Mike Wilson won the 330, all in semifinals.

N. C. Central's only winner was junior Ronnie Ray in the 220. The Eagles finished fourth in team standings.
