DelState women win MEAC track

SALISBURY, Md. - Saint Dorcas Turner won three separate events and added a second-place finish to lead Delaware State College women's team to first place in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Indoor Track Championships Saturday.

Turner, a sophomore nursing major, was voted the Most Outstanding Performer in the tournament, and second-year coach Walter Tullis of DelState was named Outstanding Women's

Coach.

Freshman Donna Ray won two events and anchored the winning mile relay for DelState, which placed first with 127 points. South Carolina State, leaders after the opening round, finished second with 101, and Florida A&M was third with 66.

"The overall team performance was nothing more than I expected." said Tullis, who set a goal of winning the indoor championship after placing first in the MEAC Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Tallahassee, Fla. last year. "Hard work and endurance helped us win the meet.

Franz Kappel took a secondplace finish in the shot put with a toss of 50-feet-21/2-inches and Winston Adams was second in the triple jump with a leap of 46-9 to lead DelState in the men's competition. The Hornets placed third with 115 points, while South Carolina State won the team title with 115 and Howard finished third at 96.

I feel very good about my performance today," said Turner. "I concentrated on a bible verse that strenghtens me and went out there and ran. Everything I did today was to help the team win the MEAC."

DelState's women took seven of 13 events. Turner won the 800-meter run, the 1500 and the 1000. Turner and Ray finished with identical times of 5:24.4 in the 1500. In the 1000, Turner placed first in 3:03.6, while Ray's 3:06.3 was good enough for second. Ray won the high jump with a 5-2 leap and placed first in the 500-meter run with a time of 1:18.3.

Lorraine Dortch, Arlene Adens, Louise Campbell and Ray gave Del-State a first place in the mile relay. The Hornets edged out FAMU at the wire with a time of 4:02.8.
