

Hamline Is Poor Second and St. Olaf Third — Several Conference Records Fall.

Collecting 79 points, almost as many as amassed by the other five schools entered, the Carleton track team romped away with the state college cinder championship for the fourth consecutive year yesterday afternoon on Norton field, Hamline. Hamline placed second with 42½ points; St. Olaf third with 22; Macalester and St. Thomas tied for fourth and fifth with seven each, and St. John, with only four men entered sixth with 6½.

Three conference records and one Hamline mark were cast into the discard by the athletes. Brandes, Hamline distance star, set his third record in two weeks, negotiating the mile in 4:34 1-5, a new conference record.

Records Fall.

Lufkin of Carleton established a new conference mark in the pole vault, and Peacock of Hamline in the high jump, while Kruse of Hamline came through with the big surprise of the meet, putting the shot over 38 feet, beating out Bowe, Carleton favorite, and establishing a new Hamline mark for the heave.

Walter Naused, former North high star now performing for Carleton, was the high scorer of the day, taking firsts

in the 440 and 880-yard runs and running on the winning relay team. Brandes of Hamline gave the Carleton star a great race for individual honors, scoring firsts in the mile and two-mile events.

Carls, Pipers Divide.

Carleton and Hamline took all the first places in the meet, Hamline sharing five of the premier positions, while the remaining events went to Hamline. Carleton led the field easily, both in the track and field events, scoring 28 points in the field and 51 on the track.
