Pole Vault Takes Time The meet was run off speedily with the exception of the pole vault, which dragged for nearly three-quarters of an hour after everything else had been an hour after everything else had been concluded. But this event had a detinite bearing on the team standing, since prior to it John Hopkins was in second place. After Gottfredi and Snow, of Catholic University, earned first and second points, and Hammel, of Delaware, finished third, both passed the Jays. Catholic finished second, Delaware third and Hopkins fourth with one point separating each. fourth, with one point separating each.
There was much interest in the twomile run. In a dual meet, Driscoll, of Johns Hopkins, had beaten MacMahon, of Washington. Driscoll was permitted to take the lead for six of the eight laps, but MacMahon passed him on the start of the seventh, and won by at least fifty yards. His time was re-markably fast, clipping 20 full seconds from the old record. The new mark is 10 minutes 4.2 seconds. Graziano Takes Javelin Ted Graziano, Johns Hopkins captain, won the javelin throw, although he did not take part in the finals on the eve-ning program, having strained a muscle while broad jumping. His trial mark of 167 feet 4 inches not only stood against all attacks on the final heaves, but all attacks on the final heaves, but established a new meet record.
