Records Fall As Shoremen Take Mason-Dixon Track Meet

To the accompaniment of breaking records, Washington College ran and jumped its way to a third straight Mason-Dixon Conference track and field championship last night at Home-

Washington won six of the eight track events, set new meet records in three and tied the old marks in two others. The Shoremen also took first place in two of the six field events, and in both the old records fell.

Eight Marks Fall

Eight records fell in all, Johns Hopkins, Delaware and Catholic University athletes setting new marks in one event each.

Basil Tully, who made records in both jumps and in the high hurdles, led the Shoremen with 23 points collected. Gibby Young, who tied records in the 100 and 220 and broke the low hurdle mark, added 201/2, and Eddie McMahan, who won the mile and twomile, setting a record in the former, contributed 10. These three scored enough points to total more than the

contending Blue Jays.

Young had broken records in the afternoon trials, running the century in 9.8 and the furlong in 22, but because of a brisk wind these marks probably will not be accepted as official, it was said.

The mile race was beautifully run. McMahan let Corbett, Catholic University freshman, set the pace until the turn before the home stretch, on which he passed him with a dash of speed that carried him to the tape in
