

Cards Win Five Mason-Dixon Titles, but Lose to Sho'men

BALTIMORE, May 14.—Although they won only two firsts, Washington College's trackmen today captured the 14th annual Mason-Dixon Conference Track and Field Championship.

The Shoremen scored 57½ points. Second - place Catholic University finished with 48½ points on the strength of five outright titles and a share in another.

Johns Hopkins, the defending champion and host college at the two-day meet, finished third with 37 points.

Other point scores: Roanoke 23⅓; Randolph - Macon 21½; Bridgewater 18; Loyola 11½; Lynchburg 5½; Gallaudet 2 and American University ⅓.

Towson State Teachers College and the University of Baltimore failed to score.

Both of Washington College's firsts were won by Larry Brandenburg, who turned in record-breaking performances in the 440 and 880 yard runs.

Brandenburg and Leon Schwartz of Hopkins staged a stirring duel in the 440. Brandenburg just lasted to win in 49.9 seconds. Schwartz's time of 50 seconds also eclipsed the meet record of 50.6 seconds he set two years ago.

Brandenburg came right back to set a new record of 1:58.8 in the 880. He came from behind to beat Dan Doyle of Catholic University by three steps.

Catholic University controlled the sprint events with John Rudd

winning the 100-yard dash and Rod Jackson copping the 220.
