

# TRACK TITLE TO ROANOKE

## Victors Take 6th Mason-Dixon Championship

Washington, May 14 (AP)—Dick Emberger scored 20¼ points today as Roanoke College rolled up 50 points to win the Mason-Dixon Conference track championship for the sixth time in the last seven years.

Catholic University, the defending champion, failed to score a point.

The surprise of the 25th annual meet came when American University scored 32 points to finish second, the highest it ever has reached.

### New Record Set

Emberger in the 120-yard high hurdles broke his old conference record of 14.7 seconds by winning in 14.6 seconds.

Bob Cuthrell, of Western Maryland College, broke the pole vault record set by Taylor Goode, of Lynchburg College, with a jump of 13 feet 4 inches. Goode's old record, set in 1957, was 13 feet 2½ inches.

Wayne Gallatin, of Baltimore University, took the 2-mile run in 9.47.2, winning over Bob Jenkins, of Roanoke College, by 60 yards.

There was a two-way team tie for third place and a three-way

tie for fifth. Bridgewater and Hampden-Sydney had 22 points each. Johns Hopkins, Loyola and Lynchburg had 18 points apiece.

Mount St. Marys scored 13 points; Washington, 10; Western Maryland, 7; Baltimore University, 5; Gallaudet, 4, and Randolph-Macon, 1. Towson also failed to score.

Arnie Sapperstein, of Loyola, won both the 100- and 220-yard dash. He won the 100 in 9.9 seconds and did the 220 in 22.3.

Bill Caperton, of Hampden-Sydney, took the 380-yard dash in 1.59.3.

Mark Diashyn, of Washington, won the 220 lows in 24.7 seconds and came in second in the 220-yard light hurdles.

In addition to setting the new 120-yard hurdles mark, Emberger won the high jump with 6 feet, 2¼ inches, the broad jump with 22 feet, 1¼ inches, was second in the 220-yard low hurdles and ran on Roanoke's winning 1-mile relay team.
