to record his 14.6 that broke a meet mark.

So tired from a long day of competition, the star Husky, who already has tied the national JC high jump record at 6ft. 8%in., settled for a 6ft. 2½in. victory last night.

Seven meet records in all went tumbling, the most prominent of these occurring in the half mile and two mile.

1:56.7 Half Mile Santa Monica's Roy Hough-ton (1:56.7) was two strides ahead of East L.A.'s Ray Cenianead of East L.A.s Ray Centeroz (1:56.9) in a thrilling 880. Allen Peterson of Coach Jim Slosson's L.A. Valley club became the first Southland JC to break 10 minutes as he easily copped the two mile in 9:56.1.
