

# Newman Second at 24-7

SANTA MONICA. — Responding to pressure on the final round, Charles Robinson and Craig Newman got off the finest jumps of their careers to place one-two in the Metropolitan Conference long jump championships at Santa Monica City College's Donald Field.

Robinson sailed 24 ft. 10 1/4 in. and Newman covered 24-7 1/4.

Standing fifth and fourth, respectively, entering the final round of competition, first Newman and then Robinson established Valley College records in the event.

Two Long Beach athletes, Gary Marchison and Martin DeWitt, had just moved even with the monarch two-man, Marchison spanning 23-7 1/4 to tie Robinson for fourth place and DeWitt going 23-4 1/4 to pull even with Newman.

As Newman took his position at the head of the runway sending a leap of 23-8 or better to qualify for the Anaheim California meet.

With a slight wind at his back, he hit the board perfectly and took off, covering 24 ft. 7 1/4 in. to take the lead from Long Beach's Bob Harriman (23-4 1/4). His mark also set a Valley College record, surpassing the old standard of 24-2 set by Don Richardson against Los Angeles City College in 1952.

It didn't last long, however, because Robinson was next in line and he, too, took advantage of a perfect takeoff and slight tailwind to smash the record set just moments before by Newman, covering 24-10 1/4, more than a foot better than his previous personal best.

Newman's other jumps in Saturday's finale measured 23-1 1/4, 23-1 1/4 and 23-4 1/4.

Robinson earlier had leaps of 23-7 1/4, 23-4 1/4 and 23-0 1/4.

Later in the afternoon a 23-11 1/4 came back to place second in the triple jump, his preliminary effort of 23-7 1/4 holding up for the
