

LAFAYETTE BEATEN

Easton Athletes Give Rutgers
Close Call for First Place in
Middle States

Two Records Fall; Made by
Cann and Bloss at New
Brunswick Track

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., May 15.—Rutgers won the eighth annual track and field championship of the Middle States Collegiate Athletic conference after a close race with Lafayette. The victory came by the close margin of 30½ to 30 points with New York University third 20 points. This is the second successive victory for the winner. Crawford, of Lafayette, was the stellar performer when without a great deal of opposition he captured the half mile and two mile events.

Two records were made during the morning trials. Cann, of New York University, threw the javelin 158 feet 3½ inches over the old mark held by McWilliams, of Lafayette of 145 feet 5 3-5 inches. The former record holder competed after qualifying for the finals with a throw of 143 feet. He did not place in the finals. Bloss of Stevens, broke the record of 22 feet three inches in the broad jump held by Many, of New York University, when he leaped 22 feet 6 inches.

Lafayette was the better gainer of first places and scored one more than Rutgers but as was expected second, third and fourth places were the deciding factors. Cann, of New York University, who was picked to win all three of the weight events lost to Pratt, of Rutgers, in the discus but won the javelin and shot-put.

The rain of Friday caused the track to be soft and was not suitable for breaking any records. The morning sun dried it up considerably for the afternoon events and some pretty fair times were made.
