RUTGERS IS VICTOR IN MIDDLE STATES

GETTYSBURG, Pa., May 14.—Rutgers, dominating the preliminaries and finals of the Middle Atlantic States Collegiate Athletic Association's track and field carnival, copped the 26th annual championships here on Nixon Field today, tallying 56 7-10 points by taking four first places and placing in all but five events. This is the tenth track and field crown for the Queensmen since the championships began in 1913.

Rutgers scored heavily in the field events, taking the discus, shot put and javelin throw. Baxter ran the 220-yard dash in a downpour, yet snapped the tape at 23.2 seconds. Washington's three-man team of Young, Tully and McMahon pushed their opponents hard and finished first in the century, 120 high hurdles and the mile run. Young, easily the outstanding performer of the carnival, topped the individual scoring honors, repeating his accomplishments of last year on the same track.

Bill Tranavitch, burly Queensman, set a new record for the shot put, when he tossed the ball 46 feet 5 1/4 inches. This bettered the previous Middle Atlantic record, made by Fischer, also of Rutgers in 1931, of 46 feet 1 inch.

ALFRED THREATENS

Scott, Dauenhauer and Hughes accounted for Alfred College's serious threat for top laurels as they led the field in the 880, and both the high and broad jumps. Alfred's freshmen team broke the tape with ease ahead of the whole field in the yearling medley.

Rothermel, of P. and M., came through in beautiful style to take the 2-mile run in 10 minutes, 5 seconds. Lehigh, taking half the places in the pole vault and javelin events and taking a number of seconds and thirds scored 28 points. Swarthmore, with Bose and Kirschlager doing double duty, garnered 12 points.

It was announced at the course that next year's meet would be held at Rutgers University, the home of the new champions, New Brunswick, N. J.
