

Lehigh Second, F. & M. Third In Middle Atlantic Events; Lewis, Greene Dual Victors

EASTON, Pa., May 11.—A well-balanced Rutgers team, which took three firsts and placed heavily in 10 of the 14 events today captured the Middle Atlantic Collegiate Athletic Association track and field championship, held at Lafayette College, for the third consecutive year. The Scarlet amassed 47½ points to gain permanent possession of the trophy.

Lehigh University was second with 31 points; Franklin & Marshall, third, with 26; Alfred fourth, with 25, and Lafayette fifth, with 24. Other teams that scored were: Haverford, 19½; Bucknell, 14; Juniata, 7; Muhlenberg, 4; Delaware, 4; Washington College, 4; Dickinson, 3, and St. Joseph's, 1. Drexel, Swarthmore and Ursinus did not score.

LEWIS SCORES DOUBLE

Harley Lewis, Rutgers, led the winners with a double victory in the 100 and 220-yard dashes. The only other double winner was Mearl Greene, of Alfred, who tied the shot-put record of 46 feet 5¼ inches held by Bill Tranavich, of Rutgers, who finished second, and also won the discus.

Lehigh led in the number of first places, four of its entries winning three final events. They were constantine, in the broad jump; Wooters, in the 440; Murphy, in the 120-yard high hurdles, and Elliott, in the 220-yard low hurdles.

Haverford Men Win

Alfred, Franklin & Marshall and Haverford each had two winners, and Lafayette one in Larry Savadkin, sophomore, who captured the mile in 4 minutes 32.6 seconds without being pressed.

Muhlenberg won the freshman medley race of 880, 440, 220 and the mile in the fast time of 7 minutes 50.8 seconds. John Psiaki ran the mile in 4:33 to finish well ahead of the rest of the field.

Easton High School won a special sprint medley for high schools, Phillipsburg being second and Wilson third.
