

Modesto JC, Fresno And McClatchy Win Relays Classic Here

Modesto Junior College scored 55 points to win the javelin division of the Modesto Relays Saturday afternoon. Fresno State College took the open class and the C. K. McClatchy High School of Sacramento was victorious in the prep event.

Although miserable weather conditions prevailed, a cold, high wind whipping up clouds of dust in the javelin stadium, about 2,000 spectators turned out and saw Eugene Cornelius Warmerdam narrowly miss breaking his outdoor world's record of 12 feet 7 1/2 inches in the pole vault.

He cleared 12 feet 2 1/2 inches and on his first try at 12 feet 9 1/2 inches, and a shot through the crowd when he sailed high into the air and appeared certain to clear the cross bar.

Almost Made It

However, he just fished it and the weather fell from the standards. In his other tries, he never was able to come close to getting over. Warmerdam's outdoor record of 12 feet 7 1/2 inches was established in the 1942 Modesto Relays.

He was disappointed in his failure to better his old mark. The day before the meet, he was on watch in connection with his jury duties until 2 A. M.

On top of this, the cold wind was a big handicap.

A number of the spectators thought Warmerdam had cleared the bar at 15 1/2, on his first try. He did get over, but hit the bar on the way down.

Parents On Hand

His parents had driven up from below Fresno to see him in action. His new relay records were etched in the books and one was tied.

Jack Patten, 218 pounder of Fresno State, set a new record of 24 1/2 in the high hurdles, smashing the mark of Lee Angellich, University of California, of 14 1/2, made last year.

Another new record was entered in the books by John Phillips, president of Maria Junior College student body, when he threw the javelin 177 feet 5 1/2 inches in the javelin class. In the open class in the same event, Lieutenant J. E. Tricker of the army, unattached, broke the open 179 feet 5 inches for another mark.

Record Is Tied

Maria of Fresno High School tied Bob Ghisetti's record of 12 1/2 in the 30 yard high hurdles.

The remainder of the new marks were established in the elementary divisions.

The high point trophies were won by Patten in the open division, Glen Shaffer of Modesto in the junior college class and Roy Green of McClatchy in the prep series. Shaffer scored 11 1/2 points Green 11 and Patten 10 1/2.

In the open event, Keating of San Francisco State led Most of Fresno by two yards in the 100. In the 200, Ken Horn of San Jose fell over the finish line to beat Keating.

Madrid Takes Mile

Corporal Buddy Madrid of the Lawrence Air Base took the mile over Coughlin and Bill Holt, the Sacramento star. Coughlin was second and Max was 12 feet behind him.

OSP practically swept the high jumps.

Jack Burke, St. Ignace High School star of San Francisco, who recently set a new international record in the discus, could not approach his mark. But he did win with a toss of 138 feet 2 1/2 inches.

Modesto surprised many by winning the junior college javelin. Ferns Ross, which had defeated the State a short time ago in a telegraphic meet, had been favored.

Due To Two Factors

Modesto's victory is due to two things—the splendid condition of Coach Fred Kari's men and to the addition of Bill Schwaneri to the squad.

Schwaneri won the broad jump, placed second in the low hurdles and third in the high.

Shaffer took both the high and the low and should have no difficulty in the Fresno Relays on Saturday, since also has third place in the one mile relay.

Waiting for the first time in competition this season, Howard Overboon of Sacramento Junior College tied for first place with Irving Mason in the pole vault at 12 feet, 6 inches. Their attempt to break the javelin record was futile.

The Mark Power

In the high school division, McClatchy had the mark all around power for the rest of the field.

In the prep 100 yard dash, an unfortunate event occurred at the start. None of the competitors failed to hear the starter's gun due to the wind and the public address system.

The official in charge blew his whistle to start them over. Only some of the boys slowed down, the others keeping on. Then those who had checked their speed tried to regain it, but could not, of course.

It really should have been declared a no-race.

McClatchy was disqualified in the 400 yard relay for passing the baton three yards over the zone. Oakdale liberally was first place.

The meet, sponsored by the Modesto Junior Chamber of Commerce and the high school and junior college, was a financial success.

Six Records Are Set In Track Event

Six new meet records were established and one was tied in the Modesto Relays, held under highly unfavorable weather conditions late Saturday.

Kenneth Cornelius Warmerdam of Del Monte Pre Flight School came close to setting a new world's outdoor record in the pole vault at 15 feet 7 1/2 inches, but just brushed the bar off. The present mark of 12 feet 7 1/2 inches was set here by Warmerdam a year ago.
