

Trojans Run 880 Relay in 1m. 24.9s.

SC Quartet Again Under Listed World Mark at Modesto

MODESTO, May 21 (AP)—Southern California's great half-mile relay team, anchored by Sprint Champion Mel Patton, bettered the world's record tonight for the third time in eight days by winning the event in the California Relays.

The Trojan quartet of George Pasquali, Ronnie Frazier, Norm Stocks and the Peerless Patton ripped off the four furlongs in 1m. 24.9s.

Last night, in the Los Angeles Coliseum Relays, the same four stopped the clock at 1m. 24s. flat, and a week ago tonight, in the West Coast Relays at Fresno, they turned the distance in 1m. 24.4s. Stanford's team of 1937 set the recognized record of 1m. 25s.

Aggies Left Behind

Oklahoma A&M, with a team fast enough to win the recent Drake Relays, was outdistanced by the far westerners, its anchor man, Dick Stolpe, finishing some 25 yards behind Patton. The other Aggies were Tom Elliott, Bill Aldridge and John Voight, running the laps ahead of Stolpe.

California finished third and the University of California at Los Angeles fourth.

Long legged Craig Dixon of UCLA raced off with the 120-yard high hurdles event in the good time of 13.9s.

It was the fastest time this year for Dixon, second only to World Record Holder Harrison Dillard of Baldwin Wallace in the timber topping event. Dixon's time was only three-tenths of a second slower than Dillard's world standard.

Easy Winner

Dixon won by five yards over Dick Attlessey of SC after taking his heat in 14.3s. Attlessey won his heat in 14.1s.

The time set a new local relays mark. The old time also was established by Dixon 14.3s. in 1947 and equaled by him a year later.

A crowd estimated at 8000 turned out for the eighth annual running of the relays.

California's crack medley relay team, with Norwegian Kaare Vefling running the one-mile anchor lap, captured the progressive yardage race handily.

Vefling Flies

Vefling finished some 40 yards ahead of the UCLA man who put his team in second place. Vefling's teammates were Phil Arnot, running the quarter-mile; Don Jackson, half-miler, and Paul Mello, negotiating the 1320 yards. Southern California's quartet was third and Stanford fourth. The time was 10m. 17.5s.

Stocky Bob Work of UCLA won the 100-yard open finals dash in the comparatively slow time of 9.8s. He broke the tape some two feet ahead of Bill Fell of Compton College, with Southern

California Freshman John Bradley third, nosing out Bob Crowe of San Jose State.

Southern California's Mel Patton, world's fastest human, led the Trojan relay team to an easy win in the 440-yard open class event. Patton, running the anchor lap, was given a lead of some three yards and improved it by at least another three feet.

The time was 41.1s. George Pasquali, Ron Frazier and Joe Scott made up the rest of the team.

Oklahoma A&M, with Bill Bowers, Ben Aldridge, John Voich and Dick Stolpe, running in that order, finished second. UCLA was third and California fourth. The Wayne University team of Detroit was fifth.

Wilbur Thompson, former Modesto Junior College athlete to whom tonight's relays were dedicated, won the shot-put at 54ft. 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. Thompson, now competing for the Los Angeles Athletic Club, set a new relay mark with the heave.

The old mark was 54ft. 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. made by Jim Delaney, Olympic Club, last year. Lew Davis, Stanford, was second at 53ft. 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ in.; Jess Swope, SC, third with 51ft. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; and Bill Bayless, SC, fourth with 50ft. 5in. Otis Chandler of Stanford, usually a point winner, did not compete because of a sore wrist.

Trojan Quartet Sets New 880 Relay Record

Southern Pacific AAU officials today were busily going through the now-familiar routine of preparing the forms necessary for the recognition of a new world's record following the sensational performance of SU's 4-man 880-yard relay team in the Coliseum Relays Friday night.

Before 48,528 thrilled fans the Trojan speedsters, anchored by the lanky speedburning limbs of Fel-Mel Patton, whizzed to a sensational 1m. 24.4s. clocking, a full second faster than the accepted standard of 1m. 25s. reached in 1937 by Stanford.

Then, last night at Modesto in the California Relays, the same foursome raced to a 1m. 24.8s. time, the third time in eight days they've lowered the mark. In the West Coast Relays at Fresno May 14 the same four lads ran 1m. 24.4s.

Thrilling Athlete

Local fans were still talking about the marvelous performance of the world's greatest women's athlete, Mrs. Fanny Blankers-Koen, who won a special 100-yard dash, an 80-meter hurdle race and anchored a triumphant four-women 440-yard relay team with a brilliant lap.

Mrs. Blankers-Koen, who leaves early this week for New York, where she'll run in exhibitions at the I.C.A. meet, will be honored today with a tea given by Dr. Adrian Hartog, Consul of the Netherlands. Mrs. Blankers-Koen won three individual gold medals in the 1948 Olympics and anchored the winning relay team there for Netherlands victories.
