

# Texas Sprint Team Equals World Record

MODESTO, May 22 (AP)—The crack University of Texas team equaled the world record for the 440-yard relay tonight when it was clocked in 49.5 at the 13th annual California Relays.

Dean Smith, Jerry Prewitt, Al Frieden and Team Capt. Charlie Thomas ran in that order to tie the mark set at Fresno in 1938 by a University of Southern California team. SC was second tonight.

## SC Wins 880

Southern California came back to show the way to the Texans in the 880-yard relay, winning in 1:24.5.

Texas' record-tying mark was achieved at a meet which saw Australia's premier sprinter, Hector Hogan, lose out to Ron Richards of Los Angeles in Hogan's nevertheless impressive American debut. Richards, former UCLA dash star competing unattached, was clocked at 9.7.

World shot-put record holder Parry O'Brien of the Los Angeles Athletic Club won his favorite event with a 58ft. 3in. heave and also bagged the discus with a throw of 157ft. 4½in. Fortune Gordien of the LAAC, discus world record holder, did not compete.

Hogan, after a slow start, sped into the lead, but was overtaken by Richards after about 85 yards. The Australian was only a fraction of a second behind at the finish.

## Ran 9.3 on Turf

After the final, Hogan said he was satisfied with his initial effort on a strange running surface. In his own country he equaled the world record of 9.3 on clipped turf two months ago.

Occidental's four-man team won the distance medley relay with Southern California second and California third. The time, 9:58.9, was a meet record. The one-mile relay for college freshmen went to the crack UCLA team, which set a new national record for first-year men of 3:15.9. The former mark of 3:17.3 was set recently by Rice Institute Fresh. Bob Sea-

man and Russ Ellis, running the last two laps, were each clocked in 47.8.

### Miller Hits 255ft. 8½in.

Bill Miller of the Camp Pendleton Marines won the javelin with a throw of 255ft. 8½in. It was the longest throw ever made by the former Arizona State (Tempe) athlete. Bud Held of the San Francisco Olympic, who finished second tonight, holds the American record of 263ft. 10in. Held reached 243ft. 4in. tonight.

Southern California won the open team title with 54 points with LAAC second with 31 23/40.
