

TEXAS SETS WORLD 440 RELAY RECORD

MODESTO, May 21 (AP)—The University of Texas smashed the world record in with a 40.2-clocking at the California Relays.

The Longhorn quartet was made up of Dean Smith, Al Freiden, Jerry Prewit, and Bob Whilden.

The old record of 40.5 was set by the University of Southern California in 1938 and has been tied several times.

The University of Houston, trailing Texas by five yards, was clocked in 40.4, also bettering the world mark.

The Longhorns held a slim lead all the way in their record-shattering effort, with Whilden standing off a great stretch drive by Houston's Larry McBride on the anchor lap.

Mild Breeze

The Texas team was made up of three-fourths of the quartet which equalled SC's old mark a year ago. The veterans are Smith, a senior, and Freiden and Prewit, juniors. Whilden, the anchor man, who replaced the graduated Charley Thomas, is only a sophomore.

A brisk northwest wind

which lashed the track during the afternoon preliminaries dropped after sundown and relays' officials said it was blowing at about two miles an hour during the race, well below the speed allowed in considering world marks.

King Dashes 9.4

Bobby Seaman anchored UCLA to a fast triumph in the distance medley relay, the Bruins turning in a time of 9:51.8, only 1½ seconds off the world mark. Seaman trailed by five yards on the final pass as he took over to run the last mile and won by 15 yards. SC finished second and Oklahoma A&M third. The Oklahomans built up 25-yard lead after two laps, but dropped to five on the final lap and Seaman ran away from Sture Landquist who faded to finish in back of Fernando Ledesma of SC.

Leamon King, University of California freshman, won the 100-yard dash in 9.4 seconds, equaling the relays record set by Mel Patton in 1947 and the national college freshman

mark held by several sprinters.

The discus was won by Jim Mathias of Occidental College with a throw of 164ft. Des Koch of SC was second on 163ft. 3in.

Will Wright, former SC star now running for the Los Angeles Athletic Club, won the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.3.

A blazing anchor lap by Dick Foerster gave the Uni-

versity of Texas the two-mile relay in a blanket finish with Bill Weiss of the Los Angeles Athletic Club and Ev Trader of Occidental. The Longhorns were timed in 7:33.5, a new relays record.
