

# Hines Equals World 100--Meter Record; Smith Skips Race

MODESTO — Tommie Smith passed up the 100 meters, but Jim Hines produced a world-record-equaling 10 flat Saturday night in upsetting national champion Charlie Greene at the 26th annual California Relays.

Hines, a barrel-chested 21-year-old from Oakland who runs for Texas Southern, took the lead from Canada's Harry Jerome with 30 meters to go and held off a fast-finishing Willie Turner of the Oregon State Frosh.

Turner, a newcomer on the track scene from Yakima, Wash., was also clocked in 10.0.

Greene, suffering only the second 100 meter loss of his career, finished third, with Jerome fourth, both in 10.1.

## Greene's 2nd Bid

Greene, who will graduate from the University of Nebraska on Friday, tried to make amends in the 220, leading Smith for over 150 yards until the world record holder turned on his jet finish to win in 20.3. Again, the youthful Turner came racing up for second in 20.4 as Greene faded to third.

Hines, who did not run the 220, was elated over his 100 meters performance.

"That was the first time I've ever beaten Greene," he said. "I wasn't surprised, though. This is my year. Next Friday I'll do even better in the 220," referring to his meeting with Tommie-Jet in the Coliseum-Compton Invitational.

## Suffers Spasm in Leg

Greene said he thought he could hold off Smith, commenting that "I felt Tommie coming up beside me, but I still had a feeling I could win until I got a spasm in my right leg."

The wind reading on the 100 meters was 4.470, barely under the allowable 4.473. Most of the early races were hampered by winds ranging over eight miles per hour, which was one reason for Smith's passing up the shorter race.

Ralph Boston, with the meet dedicated to him, tried his best to better his own world long jump record for the 10,876 fans but finished with a

leap of 27-2 1/4, equal to the fifth best of all time. His record is 27-4 3/4.

Bob Beamon, the youngster who is a freshman at the University of Texas at El Paso, kept pressure on Boston with a leap of 26-8.

Imperial Valley JC's Ron Jesse, who failed last week to qualify for the State JC meet which was run here concurrently Saturday night, leaped 25-7 1/4 for fourth place in the open long jump. This was five inches better than the JC winner.

#### Evans Breezes: 45.6

Lee Evans, who chased Smith to world records in the 440 and 400 meters last Saturday, had things all to himself in the 440 here, demolishing a strong field in 45.6. Evans, a San Jose State teammate of Smith, was timed in 45.3 for the 400 meters. Far back was Felix Johnson of Prairie View A&M in 46.7, with Pacific-8 champion Steve Pancoast fourth in 46.8.

A pair of USC school records were recorded by half miler Dennis Carr with an excellent 1:47.7 and discus thrower Gary Carlsen with 205-2. Carr finished strong to upset Canada's Bill Crothers, who was clocked in 1:47.9.

Carlsen finished fourth, but if it is any consolation, it was the longest fourth place discus throw in history. Czechoslovakia's 30-year-old Ludvik Daneš was the winner at 209-4, with three others, Rink Babka (207-1), Jay Silvester (205-4) and Carlsen over 200 feet.

#### Davenport Runs 13.5

Willie Davenport bested an evenly matched high hurdle field in which the first finishers were timed in 13.5. Tennessee's Richmond Flowers was second, UCLA's Ron Copeland third and ex-Olympian Blaine Lindgren fourth.

Ron Larrieu, the tiny national AAU cross country champion, scored an impressive two mile win in 8:32.0, fastest in the world this year. Favored Tracy Smith finished fourth in 8:36.2 and Belgium's Gaston Roelants fifth in 8:38.3.

The crowd was disappointed when the man everyone wants to see, Tommie Smith, did not run in the mile relay. San Jose State was a late scratch when Ken Shackelford suffered a pulled muscle in the 440 relay.

In the absence of the Spartans' American record team, Rice captured the relay in 3:07.1 with Conley Brown anchoring in 46.1.
