Silvester Wipes Out World Discus Record BY SHAV GLICK

Times Staff Writer MODESTO-Gusty winds can ruin a track meet for everyone but a dis-

cus thrower Jay Silvester, a 30-year-old insurance man from Smithfield, Utah, took advantage of "ideal wind" to obliterate the world record with a 218 feet 4 inch discus throw in the California Relays here Saturday

The heralded 440 relay duel between USC's world record holders and the Tommie Smith-anchored Santa Clara Valley Youth Village failed to materialize when the

Trojans' Lennox Miller pulled up in the 100 meters and the relay team

withdrew. Miller was running a solid third behind Charlie Greene, the winner in 10.1, and Jim Hines, when he suddenly felt a twinge in his leg about five yards from the tape. The race was so close that Miller finished

seventh in 10.3. Coach Vern Wolfe, taking no chances with his ace sprinter, said Miller would not run at San Diego or the Coliseum-Compton Invitational so he would be ready for the NCAA

Hines, after barely failing to catch

Greene in the 100, turned things around in the relay by staying off a surging Smith to win for the Hous-

ton Striders in 39.8. Greene's time of 10.1, only a tenth off the world record, was not wind-aided, but USC's Earl HcCullouch was not so fortunate in the

high hurdles. Earl the Pearl, off to his usual blitz start, was too fast and too smooth as he easily defeated Tennessee's Richmond Flowers and National AAU champion Willie Davenport in 13.3. This, too, was only a tick off the world mark, but the wind of 4.57 was a fraction too much

for the record books. Silvester, who once held the world record at 199-21/2 back in 1961, added nearly five feet to the 213-111/2 posted by Czechoslovakia's Ludvik Danek in 1965 at Sokolov, Czechoslovakia. Danek also had an unofficial 216-9 at the Long Beach "wind tunnel" in 1966. "It's about time it came back home, grinned the 6-21/2, 245-pound ex-Utah State weight man. "The Europeans have held it

(world record) ever since I had it. "And this one was much more rewarding to me. You don't know how great it is to once lose it, and then get it back," Silvester said in comparing his two world record efforts. "It makes you feel young again."

Throwing into a strong, quartering wind, Silvester's series was 212-2, 211-7, 200, 154, foul, 218-4. The third and fourth throws were unmeas-

This was only Silvester's third meet in the U.S. this year, but he admitted to having a "believe it or not" throw three weeks ago in a 60mile per hour gale near his home in

1964 and placed fourth.

Silvester said he "died" during a lull between the trials and the finals, after having had thrown a lifetime best of 212-2 on his first effort.

"Then I saw (Tim) Vollmer do 204-2 and I decided if he could do it, why couldn't I. That was seven feet better than Vollmer had ever done. It definitely got my adrenalin excited, and that was what I needed," said Silvester in explaining his erratic series.
