

INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS.

Contests of the New England Association at Worcester.

WORCESTER, Mass., May 24.—The second annual meeting of the New England Intercollegiate Athletic association was held on the fair grounds here to-day. Fully 2,000 people were in attendance and saw a fine exhibition of athletics. The colleges represented were Dartmouth, Amherst, Williams, Brown, Trinity, Wesleyan, and the Worcester Polytechnic institute. The greatest rivalry was between Dartmouth and Amherst for the championship which the Hanover boys won last year at Hartford. They had to succumb this year, however, to the Amhersts, who captured seven first and three second prizes, Dartmouth getting but six firsts. Eleven of the records made last year were broken—the two-mile run, 100 yard, 220 yard, quarter mile, standing high jump, putting the shot, throwing the hammer, two-mile bicycle, pole vault, standing broad and running broad jumps. The events and winners were as follows:—

Quarter mile run—Gove of Dartmouth, 53 seconds; Bulkeley of Trinity, second.

Two mile run—Ellis of Dartmouth, 10 minutes, 24.5 seconds; Gilbert of Amherst, second.

One hundred yard dash—Keay of Dartmouth, 10.3-5; Allen, W. P. I., second.

Standing high jump—Cook of Williams, 4 feet, 11¾ inches; Cook of Brown, second.

Mile run—Wells of Amherst, 4 minutes, 40.4-5; Lee of Williams, second.

Running high jump—Ludington of Amherst, 5 feet, 4½ inches; Cobb of Dartmouth and Amadon of Williams tied for second.

Throwing hammer—Bodwell of Dartmouth, 82 feet, 9¾ inches; Selick of Williams second.

Mile walk—Bradford, W. P. I., 8 minutes 14 seconds; White of Williams, second.

Two mile bicycle—Delabarre of Amherst, 6 minutes, 51 seconds; Harriman of Worcester Polytechnic Institute, second.

Standing broad jump, Crook of Williams, 10 feet 5¾ inches, Garfield of Amherst second.

Half mile run, Porter of Amherst, 2 minutes 6½ seconds, Lee of Williams second.

Pole vault, Warriner of Amherst, 9 feet 7 inches, Marshall of Worcester Polytechnic and Shannon of Trinity tied for second.

One hundred and twenty yard hurdle, Ludington of Amherst first, Dadmun of Worcester Polytechnic second; no time.

Putting the shot, Chandler of Dartmouth, 33 feet 1 inch, Wakins of Amherst second.

Running broad jump, Warriner of Amherst, 20 feet 2¼ inches, Jewett of Worcester Polytechnic second.

Two hundred and twenty yards dash, Allen of Worcester Polytechnic, 23¾ seconds, Dadmun of Worcester Polytechnic second.

Tug of war, Dartmouth beat Brown 8 inches; Williams beat Worcester Polytechnic 1 inch; Dartmouth and Williams tied, and in the pull off Dartmouth won by four inches.
