

RECORDS WERE SMASHED.

New England Intercollegiate Association Meeting.

AMHERST WINS THE PENNANT.

Eight Records Broken—Notable Work by Wells, the Amherst Runner and Crook of Williams, the Champion Standing High Jumper—The Events in Detail.

WORCESTER, Mass., May 28.—The fourth annual field meeting of the New England Intercollegiate Association was held here this afternoon on a slow track and very wet grounds. During the afternoon rain fell at intervals, delaying the games, and making the track very slippery. Nevertheless over 1,500 people saw eight records broken, one of them being the world's amateur record. This was in the standing high jump, in which S. Crook of Williams cleared 5 feet 1½ inches, the previous record being 5 feet 1¼ inches, made by W. Soren at Mott Haven games, May 29, 1880. The track officers were all members of the Manhattan Athletic Club and ran the sports through in fine style. Amherst won the pennant with 10 firsts and 4 second prizes, Dartmouth second with 4 firsts and 5 seconds, Williams third, 3 firsts and 3 seconds.

The winners in the various events were:—

100 Yards Dash—Raley, Amherst, 10 2-5 seconds; Williams, Dartmouth, second. Record broken.

Tug of War—Williams vs. Dartmouth, first pull won by Williams by one-fourth inch; second pull, won by Williams by one-fourth inch.

Half-Mile Run—Jackson, Amherst, 2 minutes 8 1-5 seconds; Hutchins, Trinity, second.

120 Yards Hurdle—Laddington, Amherst, 17½ seconds; Ralston, Wesleyan, second. Record broken.

Pole Vault—Ewing, Amherst, 9 feet 3 inches; Hovey, Brown, 9 feet 3 inches, making this in vaulting off a tie for second place.

220 Yards Dash—Williams, Dartmouth, 2 minutes, 3 4-5 seconds; Dadmun, Worcester, second. Record broken in one of the trial heats.

Two-Mile Bicycle—Hallock, Amherst, 7 minutes, 14 2-5 seconds; Delabarre, Amherst, second.

One Mile Run—Wells, Amherst, 4 minutes, 35 4-5 seconds; Carr, Williams, second. Record broken.

Throwing Sixteen Pound Hammer—Abbott, Dartmouth, 83 feet, 10 inches; Little, Dartmouth, 80 feet, 2 inches. Record broken.

Quarter-Mile Run—Shamuck, Amherst, 52 2-5 seconds; Jackson, Amherst, and Rowe, Dartmouth, ran dead heats for second.

Standing High Jump—Cook, Williams, 5 feet 1¾ inches; Fish, Worcester, second.

220 Yards Hurdle—Ide, Dartmouth, 28 seconds; Ralston, Wesleyan, second.

Mile Walk—Gregg, Amherst, 7 minutes 22 seconds; Raub, Amherst, second. Record broken.

Running High Jump—Barrows, Brown, 5 feet 5 inches; Francis, Williams, 5 feet 5 inches, making this in jumping off a tie for second.

Putting 16 Pound Shot—Alexander, Amherst, 34 feet ¾ inches; Houghton, Amherst, 34 feet 1¾ inches.

Standing Broad Jump—Potter, Dartmouth, 20 feet 2 inches; Humphreys, 20 feet 1 inch.

Two-Mile Run—Wells, Amherst, 19 minutes 23 3-5 seconds; Carr, Williams, second.

Standing Broad Jump—Crook, Williams, 10 feet 4½ inches; Gesner, Trinity, 9 feet 7½ inches.
