

## On the Cluder Track.

When the first race was called in the afternoon, Hampden Park was thick with college students and their friends, and on all sides resounded the different college cries. The grand stand and boxes were all crowded, and many carriages and people lined the ropes. The races were all good and the time excellent. The first record to be broken was the half-mile run, which was lowered 2 seconds by H. L. Dadmun, of Worcester. The record in the 100-yards dash, 10 3-5s., was equalled by S. P. Boardman, Amherst. The record in the quarter-mile run was lowered by G. B. Shattuck, of Amherst, from 53 1-5s. to 50 1-5s. The record of the mile walk was lowered from 7m. 22s. to 7m. 17s. The record in the pole-vault was broken by 5 in. by E. C. Potter, of Dartmouth, making the present record 10 feet. The sixteen-pound shot was put 2ft. 1 1/4 in. further than ever before in the association's meetings, by N. D. Alexander, Amherst; by 1ft. 6 1/4 in. by G. George, Dartmouth, and by 4 1/4 in. by E. C. Potter, Dartmouth.

The record in the 120-yard hurdle race was broken by F. H. Ralsten by 1/8 s.; time 17s. In leaping the last hurdle, C. C. Russell, Amherst, fell, seriously injuring himself. He was carried from the track, when it was found that both bones in his left wrist were broken. The record in the 220-yard hurdle was lowered from 28s. to 26 2-5s. The record in the 220-yard dash was lowered from 23 2-5s. to 22 3/4 s. by R. L. Pellett of Amherst.

Final heat, 220-yards dash, won by R. L. Pellett, Amherst, time 29-8; A. A. Ewing, Amherst, second; F. E. Rowe, Dartmouth, third.

Throwing the hammer, 16-pound, won by C. S. Little, Dartmouth, distance 94ft., 1-6in. (This breaks the previous record by over 11ft.); F. W. Allen, Amherst, was second.

Standing high jump, won by F. B. Walker, 4ft. 9-6in.; E. H. Fish, Worcester, second.

Running broad jump, won by E. C. Potter, Dartmouth, 21ft. 1-6in. (This breaks previous record by 1ft. 1-6in.) W. H. Hall, Wesleyan, was second.

From an athletic standpoint the meeting was a remarkable one. In eleven out of the seventeen events the best previous association records were broken, in one other the time was within three-quarters of a second of the record, and in another the former time was equalled twice.

The standing of the various colleges is as follows: Amherst, nine firsts, four seconds; Dartmouth, four firsts, six seconds; Wesleyan, two first, one second; Williams, one first, three seconds; Worcester, one first, three seconds; Brown, one first; Vermont, one second.

In the evening the Trinity Glee and Banjo clubs gave a concert at the opera house before a good-sized audience.
