

BOSTON TECH VICTORS.

Brown Second and Williams Third.

SEVERAL RECORDS SMASHED AT WORCESTER.

Surprise For Collegians at the Championship Athletic Meeting—Trinity Makes Three Points—The Ball Game.

Worcester, Mass., May 22.

Two thousand people saw the Massachusetts Institute of Technology athletes carry off the pennant to-day at the eighth annual championship meeting of the New England Intercollegiate Association. The games, which were held at the oval, were all hotly contested, and when the result was fore-shadowed the joy of the Boston delegation was unbounded. Dartmouth was confident of retaining the banner, but the ex-champions had to be content with fourth place. The Brown boys surprised themselves by winning second place, Williams took a big jump into third place, Amherst was fifth, Bowdoin sixth, Wesleyan seventh, Trinity eighth, Worcester Tech and Vermont University being shut out. The score by points is: Massachusetts Technology, 28; Brown, 25 1-3; Williams 24; Dartmouth, 18 1-3; Amherst, 15 1-3; Bowdoin, 8; Wesleyan, 5; Trinity, 3; Worcester Tech, 0; Vermont University 0.

In the morning, which was very heavy, the Trinity and Worcester Polytechnic teams played ball before a small crowd. The Worcester boys were the winners by a score of 12 to 2. The Trinity put in a substitute pitcher, playing as follows: Broughton, a. s.; Hennessy, 2b.; Dingwell, 2b., p.; Smith, D., 1. f.; Williams, c.; Young, c. f.; Gage, r. f.; Langford, 1b.; Cogshall, 1. f., 2b. The weather was wretched all day and at times during the events it rained hard. Nevertheless the track was in top shape and five records were smashed. H. Chase, Dartmouth, lowered the 120-yard hurdle to 16 seconds and was not forced. Marrison, M. I. T., clipped 1-5 of a second from the two-mile bicycle record, riding in 5 minutes, 28 2-5 seconds. Houghton, Amherst, made the mile walk in 7 minutes, 15 2-5 seconds. V. F. K. Smith, Brown, threw the hammer 100 feet, 10 inches, and smashed that record to pieces, and F. W. Marvel, Brown, made a great jump of 22 feet, 2 2-8 inches, and added over a foot to the running broad jump record.

About thirty Trinity students, including the ball team came up from Hartford. Carter secured second place in the shot-putting, but the distance of the winner, 27 feet 2 1/2 inches, was over two feet behind Carter's record. In the bicycle race Greenley rode a splendid race and finished second in his heat. In the final heat he finished only fourth, which was mainly due to his lack of experience, beginning his spurt too late.

The majority of the Trinity boys left Worcester on the 5:35 train, the Boston "Tech," giving them a send-off at the depot.

For Wesleyan, Jarvis ran a good race in the half mile, breaking the record, but he was taken sick soon after. He started in the one and two-mile runs, but was forced to drop out after running a short distance. Sutton ran well in the two-mile run, and with an another year's experience should prove a first-class man. Jarvis returned to Middletown tonight and will at once endeavor to get into trim for the Mott Haven games Saturday. Although it is generally conceded that Orton of the University of Pennsylvania will win the two-mile run, Jarvis, if he gets into condition, will give him a hard tossle and many Wesleyan men think there is a chance of his winning.
