Intercollegiate Meet Held at Worcester.

Brown Second With 28 Points to Her 40.

Stephen Chase Took Three Firsts to Hanover.

Smith Makes New Record for Hammer Throwing.

Perkins, W. P. I., Badly In- jured in Bicycle Overturn.

WORCESTER, May 23—The 10th annual championship contests in track and field sports of the N. E. I. A. A. took place on the grounds of the Worcester A. C. at Lakeview this afternoon, fully 200 persons applauding the meritorious performances and close finishes.

Dartmouth, as was expected, won the lion's share of the events, but astonished everybody by winning out 40 points, Brown getting in second with 28 points to her credit.

There never was a moment when Dartmouth's supremacy was in doubt, for the men began winning early in the game and kept adding points all the afternoon.

As usual Stephen Chase, the international champion hurdler and president of the N. E. I. A. A., covered himself with glory by winning three firsts for Dartmouth, the 120-yard hurdles, 220-yard hurdles and running broad jump. He won the same events last year.

D. F. O'Brien of Brown, well known in amateur circles, captured both the 100 and 220-yard runs, and by his well-judged running and remarkable bursts of speed at critical parts of his races he won the golden opinions of the experts, as well as the applause of the crowd.

The surprise of the day was the defeat of Smith, the Brown giant, in the shot-putting contest by the Maine lad, E. R. Godfrey of Bowdoin. Godfrey is last year's Maine I. S. A. A. champion.

After hurling the sphere 28 ft 6 in in today's contest, Smith protested the put, claiming that Godfrey overstepped the circle and threw rather than put the shot.

The judges decided the put a fair one, and after measuring the circle it was found that while Godfrey had left the impression of the toe of his shoe on the white circle mark, it was within the prescribed seven feet, the white mark being one inch wide.

Smith, however, took the stiffening all out of the handle in throwing the 16-pound hammer, and left a new mark of 123 ft 8 in for future athletes to try for.

Houghton of Amherst, as was expected, won the one-mile walk. He tried to create a new record, but fell short.

C. E. Bosler, last year's champion, won the 880-yard run after a fine race. Cummings of Tech was crowded out or tripped on the second return on the first lap and fell. He was so far behind on regaining his feet that he was badly

out of the race and did not get placed. Garey won the two-mile bicycle race for Dartmouth by only three-quarters of a wheel. He was forced to pedal for his life by Donohue, the little Tufts flyer. Pringle of Dartmouth won the one-mile run with F. A. Tower of Wesleyan second. Tower surprised the crowd in the two-mile run, later in the afternoon, by winning out handsomely over a big field of starters in a race in which he was never seriously thought of.

The bicycle races were anything but satisfactory on account of the dangerous corners.

In two of the heats the men were thrown, and in both instances several were hurt.

In the first heat Mossman of Amherst went down on the easterly turn just beyond the grand stand. A. C. Foster of Brown and G. Smith, M. I. T., crashed into him, and over they went, men and wheels all mixed up. Foster shook the cinders off his clothing, remounted and started in to cut down the leaders, but they had too big a start.

In the third heat six men started, and all but Andrews went down on the same corner. W. H. Perkins, W. P. I., plowed through the cinders for yards, and before he could recover himself the four other whitemen and wheels were on top of him. He was picked up by friends and carried in a helpless condition to the clubhouse close by.

A physician was called for in the audience and Dr Woodbury of Worcester responded.

After an examination it was deemed advisable to have Perkins removed to the hospital, the ambulance being called. He was badly hurt about the head, and his skin was actually torn off in the contact with the rough cinders. This dampened the interest in the events for a short time, but it was soon revived, especially as the progress of the Brown-Holy Cross ball game was being announced by innings.

It was a Brown crowd, and when the final score was given out the cheering was general.

In the running high jump there was a tie for second place between Littell of Trinity and Tyler of Amherst, both doing 5 ft 6 in. In the jump off Littell cleared 5 ft 7 in, and Tyler failed to better his old mark.

The pole vaulting was unusually good. N. A. Wyatt, Wesleyan, with a mark of 10 ft 8 1/2 in, closely shaving the association record.

Among the contestants in the running high jump and running broad jump was A. H. Green, M. I. T., formerly of Harvard. His form was very raw, he having had little or no training.

Among the interested spectators was Pres Babbs of the N. E. A. A. U. and many other officials of that and kindred associations.
