

Worcester, Mass., May 20.—Sturdy athletes from Bowdoin proved dark horses in the annual athletic meet of the N. E. I. A. A. at the oval today, winning by a single point over the Williams team, which was heralded as a victor. The score was 23 points for the Bowdoin men to 22 for Williams.

A meeting of the executive committee however, was necessary to settle the victory, a dispute having arisen over the pole vault. Hurlburt of Wesleyan won the event with a jump of 10 feet, 6 inches. Three men, Wilder of Dartmouth, Clark of Bowdoin and Squires of Williams were tied at 10 feet. It was the last event on the card and the score stood 21 to 20 in Williams' favor. The referee, H. A. Adams, was appealed to, Clark insisting on jumping off the tie instead of dividing the points. The referee ordered a jump-off. Wilder withdrew. Clark beat out Squires by a vault of 9 feet 9 inches, Squires going 9 feet, 6 inches. The executive committee late this evening decided to abide by the decision of the referee. Williams' protest was based on the fact that by the rules of the I. C. A. A., under which the meet was pulled off, it is unequivocally stated the points must be divided in case of a tie. The by-laws of the New England Intercollegiate association have no rules governing the pole vault other than those of the I. C. A. A. The summary:

Pole vault—Won by J. L. Hurlburt, Jr., Wesleyan, 10 feet six inches; W. B. Clark, Bowdoin, second; F. Squires, Williams, third; nine feet six inches both.

Throwing 16-pound hammer—Won by F. C. Ingalls, Trinity, 121 feet, 2 inches. (In try for record, made 126 feet, 1-2 inch); D. H. Hall, Brown, second, 110 feet, 4 inches; F. Corson, Dartmouth, third, 98 feet, 1 inch.

Throwing the discus—Won by A. S. Grover, U. of M., 108 feet, 1-2 inch; I. H. Hall, Brown, second, 103 feet, 7 inches; T. P. Winslow, Amherst, third, 102 feet, 11 inches.

Running high jump—Won by F. K. Baxter, M. I. T., 5 feet, 7 1-2 inches; C. Brown, Brown; E. S. Littell, Trinity and F. S. Cline, Wesleyan, tied for second place, points divided, and Littell of Trinity drew second, Brown third and Cline fourth.
